**KRS 160.295 permits a school district to adopt a student codes of rights \& responsibilities, that may consist of "two (2) students, two (2) parents of students, two (2) faculty members), two (2) representatives from administrative personnel, and one (1) member of the local school board. Opinion of the Attorney General 79-322 opines that a different committee structure is permissible where all elements of the community are represented, and the board of education has the final determination of such a code.
