

Dayton High School
SBDM Minutes
February 23, 2015

Principal Jeremy Dodd called the February 23rd meeting to order at 4:00 pm in the Dayton High School Library. Members present included: Bonnie Sizemore, Barb Lund, Linda Griffith, Angela Gonzalez, Angie Buschle, and Jeremy Dodd. Others in attendance at the meeting: Cari Cavanaugh, Michael Rowe, Michelle Cassidy, Ron Kinmon, Amy Bauereis, Erin Goetz, Anthony Brooms, and Brad Hunt.

Angie Buschle made a motion to accept the agenda. The motion was seconded by Angela Gonzalez. The motion carried.

Bonnie Sizemore made a motion to accept the January minutes. The motion was seconded by Barb Lund. The motion carried.

Public Comment

- Cari Cavanaugh said the all grades were not put into Infinite Campus before progress reports went out, but on a positive note she received a phone call from a teacher about something good her son did.

Committee Report

- **Math Department**
 - Amy Bauereis reported 4 students almost completed 7th grade Tenmarks, 46 percent are showing growth based on STAR Math, 24 students are on grade level and Algebra ready. We have 19 students still working below grade level, but 74 percent have improved on Student Growth Goals Assessment.
 - Erin Goetz reported 22 8th grade students are on grade level (algebra ready) while only 6 are working below grade level. Ms. Goetz said 55 percent are showing growth on STAR Math. The Middle School teachers are meeting with each student to discuss progress and tell them about the incentive program with Math KPREP problems. If the students want to participate, their names would go into a drawing for gift cards. KPREP practice with live scoring will be in March.
 - Anthony Broome reported that 91 percent of Algebra I students are in the A to C range. This is due to going over their work in class and finding the problems and showing how to correct what they don't understand. Only 1 student is failing and 1 is in Credit Recovery. Mr. Broome is getting away from PLATO and going back to traditional instruction due to student needs.
 - Brad Hunt reported 3 students have met their Bench Marks, 5 students have met their goals and 17 are math ready. They have 3 more chances to met their goals.
- **Arts and Humanities**
 - Linda Griffith reported we purchased the Destiny Program. This is a catalog and distribution program where students can search for books and check them out on line and come in and pick them up. This program has a \$200 yearly maintenance fee.
 - The 7th Annual Fine Arts Festival is March 19th from 5:30 to 7:30. There will be an Art Gallery open in the Library from 5:30 to 7:00, where student work can be viewed and purchased. A spaghetti dinner will be served from 6:00 to 6:45 in the cafeteria. The Band will hold a Concert from 7:00 to 7:30 in the gym.

Student Achievement

- Out of our 41 seniors, 7 are only 1 Bench Mark away from their goal.
- Sophomores are showing the most potential of all our students.
- Middle School has shown the highest growth in English and Math for our school.

Old Business

- The ½ credit policy needs to be talked about with the students to let them know what is going on. You will need a 70 or higher to get the ½ credit. We don't want more than 20 students in on line.

New Business

- The new Leadership Committee will review By-Laws, make changes and send them to the Council. They will also write procedures to elect teachers to the council. They will do a survey to see if teachers want one year or two on Council.
- Boosters will write procedures to elect parents to the council.

This is first reading of the changes. Bonnie Sizemore made a motion to accept the changes. Barb Lund seconded the motion. The motion carried.

- Mr. Dodd told us that Mr. Hunt and Mr. Volpenhein are teaching an ACT class after school from 3:00 to 4:30, on Tuesday and Thursday for first time students taking the ACT next week.
- Mr. Dodd reported our enrollment is about 364. Out of the new students taking the ACT this year, 20 percent have a Bench Mark of 14.
- Mr. Dodd told us about our School Leadership Committee. We have 9 teachers on the committee and half are working on the Hand Book and half are working on Academics. We may change our grading policy to help our students compete with other schools with KEYS money.
- Performance based grading is something we are looking into. With this grades are based on what you know (if you don't know the material you have a chance to retake until you know the material).
- Mr. Kinmon told us we will be adding a new Business Teacher next year so we can get every student Micro Soft Certified and therefore they would be career ready. Middle School students will then be able to take a business class. Mr. Martin will help with the hiring of the new business teacher.
- Mr. Kinmon also told us we are also adding a Registrar because we are losing two counselors next year and this will free Ms. Newsome up to do what the other two counselors were covering.
- Michelle Cassidy said funds need to be looked at and readjusted before the end of the year.

Bonnie Sizemore reported on the AdvancED Standard 2, Leadership. We got a 3 on decision making. Next time there should be smaller groups. We received a 2 in leadership. Council should look at PD's and the budget for them. We maybe need training on parent engagement.

Angie Buschle will report on Standard 3 at the next meeting.

We decided we need to review some existing policies at every meeting.

Mr. Dodd talked about money being spent out of Office Supplies.

Barb Lund made a motion to transfer \$500.00 into Office Supplies. Bonnie Sizemore seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Angie Buschle made a motion to adjourn. Barb Lund seconded the motion. The motion carried. Mr. Dodd adjourned the meeting at 6:00 p.m.
