New Accountability Framework

The U.S. Dept of Education's Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) has developed a *new* accountability framework, called **Results Driven Accountability (RDA)**.

- ❖ Seeks to <u>balance</u> the educational results and outcomes for children with disabilities <u>with</u> the compliance requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
- Includes States' development of a State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP)







State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP)

On **April 1, 2015**, Kentucky, along with all other states, will submit to OSEP <u>Phase 1</u> of a <u>comprehensive</u> and <u>multi-year</u> SSIP, *focused on improving educational results and outcomes for students with disabilities*.

Kentucky's SSIP will *increase the capacity of districts* to <u>implement</u>, <u>scale up</u>, and <u>sustain</u> evidence-based practices.


Kentucky will implement a **framework** to deliver **intensive** and **targeted** support in <u>identified</u> districts, while providing all districts with **universal support**.

College/Career Readiness Rate (CCR) for SWD

78% not ready

While Kentucky's College/Career Readiness (CCR) Rate overall is **62.3%**, a significant improvement from our 2010 baseline of 34%, the CCR rate for SWD is only **21.9%**.







Reading proficiency for SWD

Elementary 67% not proficient

Middle 78% not proficient

High 85% not proficient







Math proficiency for SWD

Elementary 73% not proficient

Middle 83% not proficient

High 87% not proficient








Why are we doing it?

Educational Cooperatives

- Kentucky's regional Educational Cooperatives (Co-op) provide educational services and programs that support districts/ schools.
- Each Co-op includes a special education division.
- Each Co-op, pursuant to receipt of IDEA funds, is developing a <u>Regional</u> Systemic Improvement Plan (RSIP) to accelerate learning and close achievement gaps for students with disabilities.





Supports the Work

- * Kentucky's SSIP **aligns to and supports**KDE's <u>broader efforts</u> to close gaps.
- The SSIP and RSIPs will enable KY to deliver the <u>differentiated</u> technical assistance and support districts need.
- ❖ The SSIP and RSIPs will <u>support</u> schools and districts in their **comprehensive improvement planning** (CSIP/CDIP).

- Articulated a focus for Kentucky's SSIP
- Kentucky's State Identified Measurable Result (SiMR) is

"to increase the percentage of students with disabilities scoring at or above proficient and to reduce novice performance in middle school math, specifically at the 8th grade level, by providing professional learning, technical assistance and support to elementary teachers around implementing, scaling and sustaining evidence-based practices in math."

 Ensured that the SiMR aligns with the Kentucky Board of Education goals, KDE Strategic Plans, and the Commissioner's priority on revitalizing KDE's efforts to close achievement gaps

What are your thoughts concerning this focus?

Convened a group of math experts (*Instructional Practices and Academic Content* team) to identify evidenced-based practices in math that are acknowledged to improve student outcomes at the elementary and middle school level

Developing a plan to deliver **differentiated TA and support** to districts in order to implement, scale and sustain evidence-based practices

- all districts will receive universal support
- intensive TA and support will be provided in nine to ten
 Transformation Zone (TZ) districts in three of Kentucky's Co-ops
- districts selected through use of a "district bio"
- Transformation Zones evidenced-based practices in math, TA and coaching will be provided to the districts by their Co-op
