ENG 102 Writing II (Written Communications course) 3 credit hours- ACT scores in Reading 20 or Compass in Reading of 85 **AND** ACT English 18 or Compass English 74

COM 181 Basic Public Speaking (Written Communications course) 3 credit hours- ACT scores in Reading 20 or Compass in Reading of 85 **AND** ACT English 18 or Compass English 74

MAT 100 College Algebra Workshop (Elective credit) 2 credit hours- ACT scores in Reading 20 and Math 19-21 or Compass in Reading of 85 **AND** Algebra 36-49. (Pre-Algebra must be 42 or above.)

MAT 150 College Algebra (Quantitative Reasoning course) 3 credit hours- ACT scores in Reading 20 or Compass in Reading of 85 **AND** ACT Math 22 or Compass Algebra 50

Students can always use the time after class to get free tutoring or take care of homework.
