- Our school leadership team is currently focusing on our mission and vision statement. We will be adopting the District mission statement (Inspire, Engage, Grow), but developing our own believes statements. We will have one mission statement for DMS/DHS. The leadership team has also been surveying parents, community members, teachers, and students about things like dress code, technology in the lunchroom, etc. We will use the data collected to rewrite the student code of conduct. We also held a student design contest for next year's agenda.
- We are inching closer to making our Gateway Technical and Community College partnership a reality. We have 9 juniors that met all the benchmarks for college readiness. Some of our sophomores took the ACT on April 18th. Students must meet all benchmarks to attend Gateway for dual credit classes.
- The annual Truth in Consequences assembly was held for 8th grade students on April 9th. We had many community volunteers including police officers, pharmacists, court designated workers, health department workers, ministers, and social workers. Students were able to simulate the consequences of poor judgement when it comes to drugs and alcohol.
- The KEES bus arrived on campus on Friday April 10th, to help juniors and seniors prepare for the financial responsibilities of college.
- MAP testing took place the week of April 20-24. Initial results look positive.
- DMS held a parent night for scheduling on April 21st. At that time students and parents were introduced to teachers, the scheduling process, sports and clubs available.
- DHS hosted its parent scheduling night on April 28th. We followed the same format as the middle school.
- Student of the month lunch was held on Friday April 10th.
- DHS softball team reached the finals of the "All A tournament" and played the championship team at NKU against St. Henry High School.
- The DMS/DHS track team won the SHDHS Invitational and collected a trophy as the 2015 Girls J.V. Champions.
- Mr. Dodd and Mr. Meyers attended the NKU teacher job expo on April 14th. We picked up 27 resumes from potential applicants and were able to project a positive spotlight on our school and district.
