The **You Be The Chemist** state challenge took place on Saturday, April 25, 2015 at the Owensboro Natural History & Science Museum. This beautiful museum located in the heart of old downtown Owensboro was the perfect back drop for this dramatic display of young scientific knowledge. 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The format of the competition used multiple choice questions that were extracted from the **You Be The Chemist** study guide material. Students were provided this study guide, plus they have access to the **You Be The Chemist** website where they can gather more knowledge.

The competition moderator was Kenny Galbraith (Brenntag Mid-South), the scorer was Amy Berry (Meade Co. Board of Education), and judging was performed by Kara Becker (Henderson Community College), Lee Kincaid (Brenntag Mid-South), and Barry Stewart (Monument Chemical). Teachers attending were Cassie Austin (Henderson South Middle School), Jamie Boeglin (Henderson North Middle School), and Assistant Principal Chad Buchman (North Oldham Middle School).

The competition was fierce as the students answered very difficult questions spanning a variety of scientific topics. At the end of six rounds of grueling competition, the final remaining student was Shivani Nellore of North Oldham Middle School. Shivani will now represent Kentucky at the **You Be The Chemist** National Challenge in Philadelphia, PA on Monday, June 22rd. Second Place was taken by Chandu Kona of North Oldham Middle School, Third Place by Clayton Snider of Stuart Pepper Middle School, and Fourth Place by Allie Morris of Stuart Pepper Middle School.

Special trophies were awarded to the four finalists and competition medals with ribbons to the other eight competitors. The winning student received a \$50 gift debit card and the others students received \$25 cards compliments of Brenntag Mid-South. To finish off a fine morning of competition, a hot pizza lunch with all the trimmings was served up for all in attendance provided by Brenntag Mid-South and Monument Chemical.
