PLTW:

Focus: Autodesk Engineering software using Inventor and Architectural Software using REVIT. Students will be able to design their own t-shirts on the first day using computer graphic software. They will receive an introduction into the Inventor / CAD drawing programs and learn how to draw 3 dimensional objects. They will also have the opportunity to use the architectural design software to design a simple structure.

Health Science:

Health Science will be offering CPR/First Aid training to students interested in the health career pathway. Each student will learn the American Heart Association current recommended CPR for adult, child, and infant as well as First Aid procedures. Students will learn how to deal with bleeding control, fracture care, choking, and hands on chest compression. They will learn how to contact EMS and how to recognize medical emergencies.



ATC Summer Programs

Grades 7-8; June 8-12

Welding:

Students will be introduced to oxy-acetylene welding and will use the skills learned to complete some basic welding art. Students are required to wear long pants with no holes or frays and long sleeves with other personal protective equipment provided.

Automotive:

Students will cover the following topics:

- Automotive Safety
- Light Maintenance and safety checks
- Fluids and Lubricants and their functions
- Tires and tire safety
- Brake Systems
- Basic Engine Operation



Information Technology:

This course is an introduction to information technology graphical editing. Students will explore work with digital pictures, photo editing, and flash animation.
