- Reading 1 to 1 field trip was held on Tuesday May 5. Student selected a book for the little devil he/she worked with all year.
- Teachers were recognized during teacher appreciation week. They were given breakfast, lunch, and DHS pens.
- AP exams were held on May 6 and May 12. We await the results.
- Anatomy students took a trip to NKU's cadaver lab on May 6.
- Students of the month for April were treated to lunch at Buona Vita on May 8.
