- CHHS held a school wide event at our football complex September 18<sup>th</sup>. The event was sponsored by the state ag department involving a staged atv accident. CHHS was one of only three or four schools selected for this event, which included guests from city and state government!
- The CHHS Bruin JROTC Battalion traveled to Tunnel Hill, Georgia, September 19<sup>th</sup> to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Southeast Region Raider Challenge at the Catoosa Area Training



Center. Schools from Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee and Kentucky filled the 50 teams that competed in Male, Female and Co-ed categories. CHHS traveled with two teams and placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in the Co-ed category and 3<sup>rd</sup> overall in the Male category. Eight team members competed in each event. The co-ed team competes with four male and four female Cadets

each. A good crowd turned out for the competition and witnessed outstanding effort and teamwork. The One Rope Bridge, Multi-bridge Crossing, Gauntlet, Cross Country Rescue, Strength Test, Team Run, Shot-put Toss, and the Obstacle Course events were physically and mentally challenging for the Cadets. The Bruins competed in the Raider Challenge for 11 hours September 20<sup>th</sup> and then attended the awards ceremony the next morning. The Bruins had a great experience competing against unfamiliar schools in such a demanding meet. The team plans to return next year. The team stopped at Lookout Mountain's Point Park and visited the Civil War museum.

The CHHS FFA conducted a community service project at Freeman Lake September 20<sup>th</sup>. They worked with the Hardin County Garden Club to help clean up a historic cabin near the new butterfly garden along Freeman Lake, which included cleaning out flower beds, picking up trash, and replanting native flowers.



- The Central Hardin Bruin JROTC Raider Team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall at the Eastern Kentucky University Raider Meet September 27<sup>th</sup> in Richmond, KY. This is one of the largest and most challenging Raider competitions in the state with 40 teams from Kentucky, Tennessee and Ohio competing in 6 events. The events include a Physical Fitness Test, Boat Race, Aid & Litter Relay, One-Rope Bridge, Mystery Event, and Tug-of-War. Schools were unaware of their standings until announced at the closing ceremony. This is the third straight year that the Bruins have placed in this competition. The Bruin Raider teams have done well this season having won the Hardin County Raider Cup and by placing 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> overall at the Southeast Region Raider Challenge in Tunnel Hill, GA. The team's final meet will be hosted by Ft Knox High School November 1<sup>st</sup>.


