The SPP&G Committee is recommending a change to the JCPS Grading Scale for the 2015-16 School Year:

Α	Above Standards	90-100%	93-100%

D	Below Standards	70-74%	70-78%

## Extensive work on Grading Scale for 2013-14 & 2014-15

- Surveyed district staff 69% supported change

  - Elementary 85% supported change
  - Middle School 84% supported change
  - High School 91% supported change

# What are we trying to do and why is this change good for students?



- The change takes into account the more rigorous content standards- Common Core State Standards (CCSS)
- The Categories and Components section and the Performance Descriptions of the SPP&G has been revised and will place greater emphasis on ensuring students mastery the content standards (more rigorous)
- The change supports equal opportunity for and levels the playing field for JCPS students as compared to student in other districts using 90-100 and 80-89 to earn scholarships and receive jobs
