Good News Report:

The following items were shared at this meeting:

- The Accelerated Reader totals for the year were 13,604 books which is an increase of 5,372 books compared to the 8,232 books that were read last year.
- There were approximately 40 students in grades 1-6 who earned their Math Facts t-shirts for the 2014-2015 school year.
- One to One Reading Program (47 total students total) 89% showed gains on MAP from fall to spring, 53% increased 10 points or more, and 100% increased their fluency progress.
- Students with their families have been utilizing the LES Library for the Summer Reading Challenge with students even bringing their reading logs with them.

1. <u>Budget Update</u> – Current Balance -- \$291.23

- A. <u>Program Review Updates</u> –Mr. Wolf shared the specific program review scores that were recently submitted for LES.
- B. <u>One to One Data</u> The students involved with this program made significant gains on their MAP and AIMSweb scores. Next year we will also participate in One to One Math Program.
- C. <u>New Hires and Vacancies</u> We currently have classified positions (two instructional assistant openings) and one classified position (one special education vacancy).
- D. <u>Advice to New Council</u> Member Chenot suggested that council members continue to be vocal and not be afraid to bring things up that are important for our school's success. Mr. Duty discussed the importance of the focus continuing to be always on student achievement and ensuring that all decisions are focused on ensuring that all students have the resources needed to learn and grow.
- E. <u>MAP Data</u> Yearly MAP Data Analysis for the 2014 2015 school year was shared with committee members.
