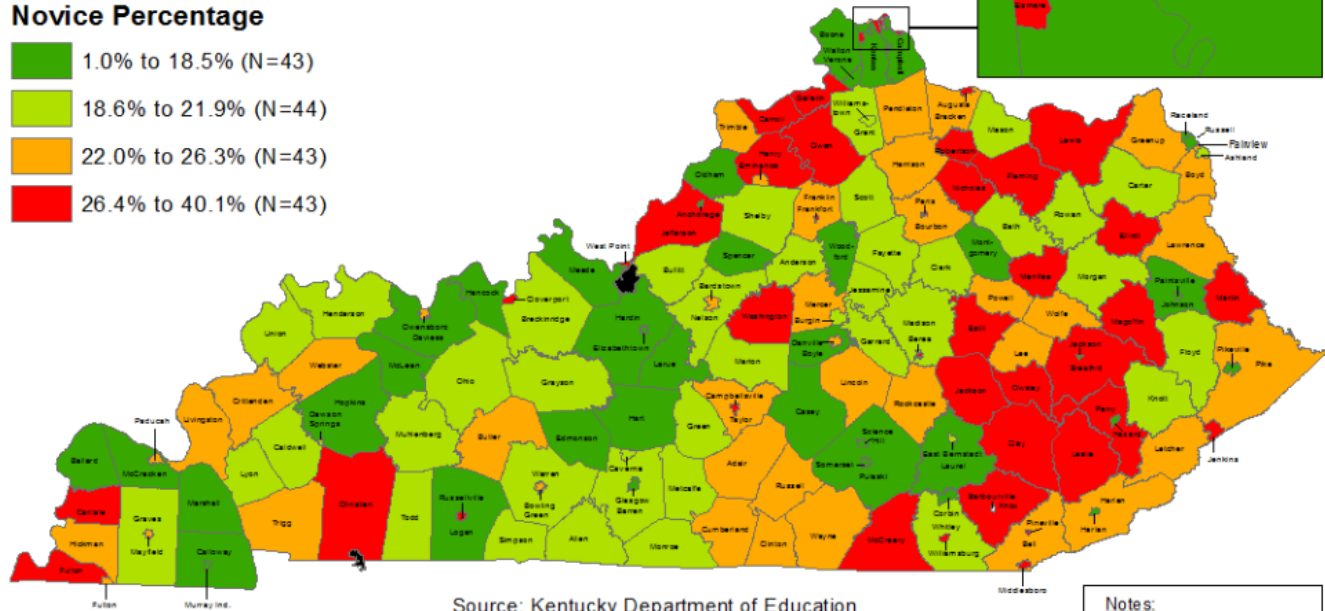

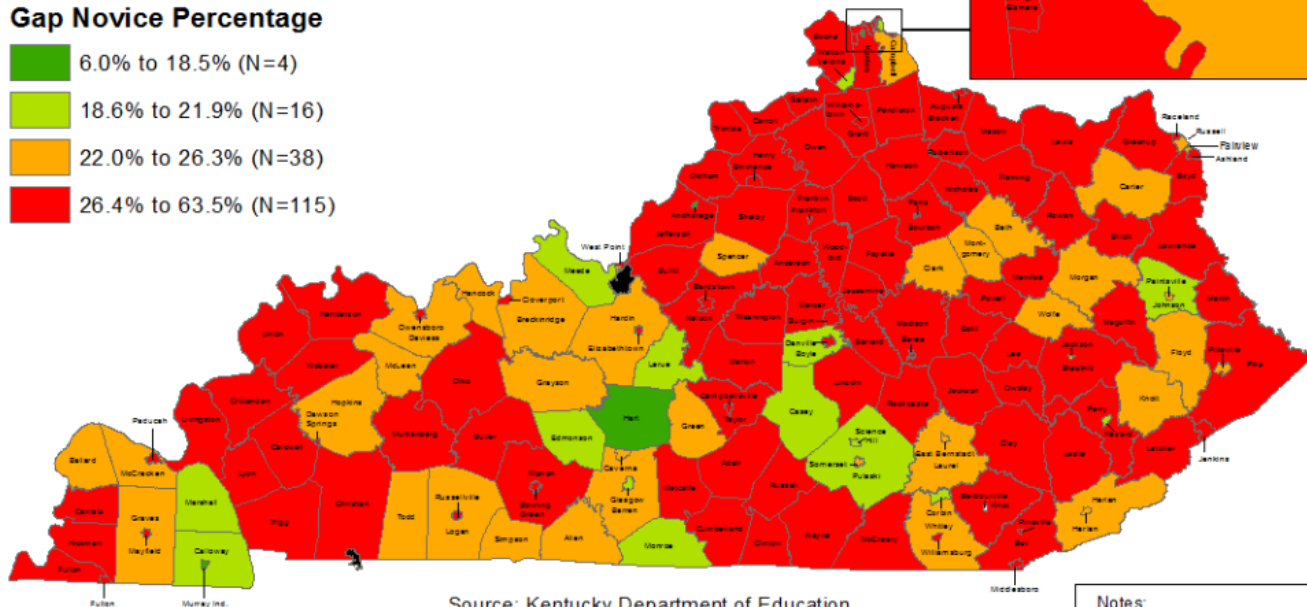
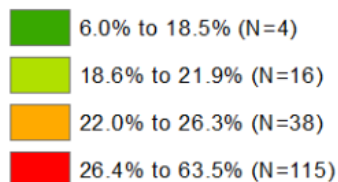
Percent of Non-Duplicated Gap Students Scoring Novice

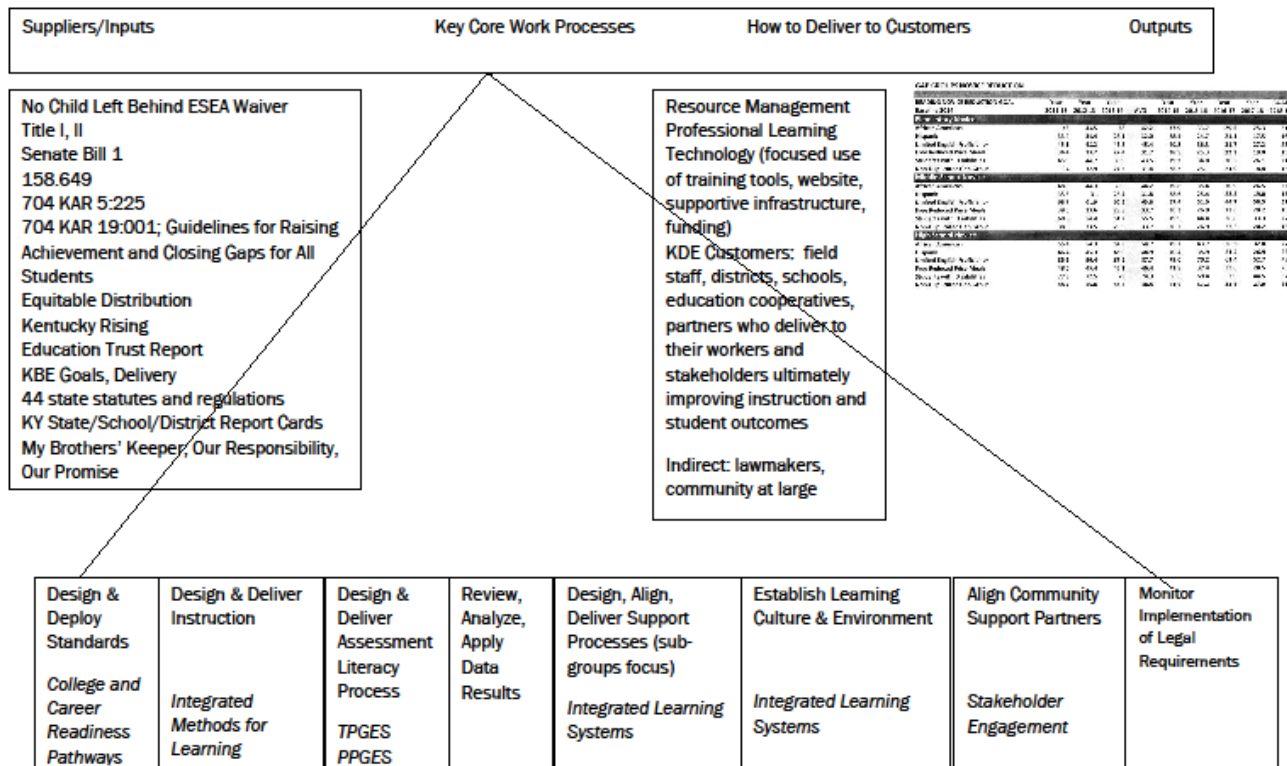

KEY CORE PROCESSES AND STRATEGIES FOR SUPPORT

	Strategies for intensive support where it is needed
1	Design & Deploy Standards (KCAS/CTE) : Do you need support in ensuring that the Kentucky Core Academic Standards and Career Technical Education curriculum are being implemented with fidelity in your school?
2	Design and Deliver Instruction : Do you need support for the Framework for Teaching, Teacher Professional Growth and Effectiveness System, Literacy Design Collaborative, Math Design Collaborative or Co-teaching for gap closure (the last 3 are only if you already have them)
3	Review, Analyze and Apply Data Results to Inform Practices: Do you need support for a repeatable system for knowing the data you have, what the data tells you and how to use the information once you have it?
4	Design and Deliver Assessment Literacy : Do you need support to ensure that the leaders in your building know how to take instructional performance data and turn it in to actionable strategies in the classroom?
5	Establish Learning Culture and Environment: Do you need support for the PLC Process, CRTL, Bullying Prevention, Attendance Initiative, PBIS, BASE(behavioral, academic, social emotional)?
6	Align Community Support Partners : Do you need support for engaging families, PTA, government agencies, corporate, faith based and other partners ?
7	Establish System for Continuous Improvement: Do you need support in understanding tools and systems you can use to continuously improve to address problems rather than crisis management? For example MTSS, SPS, PDSA, Plus/Delta, linkage, 30 60 90 planning,etc.)
8	Align Resources and Practices: Do you need support in aligning your CSIP to include use of resources to support best practice strategies.
