

Lincoln Elementary School "Home of the Little Devils" Board Report for September 23, 2015

- ❖ Teachers and administration have been analyzing student performance data in the areas of reading, math, and language usage from the fall MAP testing session over the past few weeks. Teachers and administration have used overall RIT scores and the class by RIT report to identify individual student needs in each respective strand of the MAP tests. A student's overall percentile and strand scores were then utilized when establishing RTI groups.
- ❖ The teachers have been working on their self-reflections, Professional Growth Plans, and Student Growth Goals during the early release working sessions on Wednesdays. The principals and Mr. Wolf have been meeting with the teachers to discuss the process for identifying an enduring skill that will be focused on throughout the year. All information must be completed in CIITS by October 2 and then shared with the school administration.
- ❖ "Students of the Month" (grades 4-6) for August will enjoy pizza with the principals on 10/2 at Buona Vita Pizzeria. Buona Vita Pizzeria will be sponsoring this program again for the 5th year in a row.
- ❖ "Stars of the Month" (grades K-3) for August will receive pancakes with the principals from McDonald's on 10/2. McDonald's has once again agreed to generously sponsor this student incentive program.
- ❖ Students established goals for MAP testing and have completed all the necessary tests. Students will receive a yellow ribbon for being on grade level, a green ribbon for reaching one of her goals, and a white ribbon for reaching all of their goals. Students can also earn a black ribbon for scoring in the 80th percentile and a tie-dye ribbon for scoring in the 90th percentile and above. The Student Recognition Assembly for the first quarter of school will occur on October 23.
- LES continues to utilize a positive reinforcement approach when dealing with student behavior. Students earn one Devil Dollar for staying on green and can shop at the Devil Store on a monthly basis. Students enjoyed the Devil Store on 9/11.



- ❖ The LES 21st Century Grant Program kicked off on 9/8. The program is being offered to students in grades 1-5. Students are being tutored by teachers on a daily basis and participate in various enrichment activities. The program is held Monday-Thursday from 3:00-6:00pm.
