

Lincoln Elementary School "Home of the Little Devils" Board Report for October 28, 2015

- The One to One Reading Orientation was held on September 28 at LES. Adult coaches will be paired with one particular student in grades 1-3 for 35:00 per week. The data supports about an 80-100% success rate when it comes to students increasing their fluency and MAP reading scores. We are also participating in the One to One Math Program with targeted students being paired up with a coach for 35:00 once a week.
- Parent Teacher Conferences were held on 10/22 from 3-7pm. Teachers discussed the quarterly report card marks, shared the fall MAP data, and explained the K-PREP Student Report sheets. The intermediate students also participated in student-led conferences where they discussed goals and progress for the year.
- Students (4-6) of the Month for August and September will be rewarded by receiving Pizza with the Principals from Buona Vita on 10/23.
- A student recognition assembly will occur on Friday, 10/24 to recognize students for the following: fall MAP testing goals, Star/Students of the Month, 1st quarter honor roll/super honor, and perfect attendance for the 1st quarter.
- Many students are participating in extra-curricular activities at LES during the fall. The following groups are currently meeting on a regular basis and preparing for upcoming performances/events: Speech and Drama, Honors Choir, Art Club, Girls on the Run, LES Student Council, Robotics, Chess Club, Wrestling, Cross Country, and 21st Century Grant.
- School-wide RTI for students in grades K-6 has begun with students being placed in appropriate groups based on K-PREP results, fall MAP data, and AIMSweb information. Teachers have begun progress monitoring all students in Tier II and Tier III groups using AIMSweb. Advisory Team Meetings were held on 10/14-10/16 to discuss each student's current progress and next steps to address any current deficiencies.
- The school administration along with Mr. Wolf, the Director of Teaching and Learning, have collaborated to target numerous students who would benefit from the Lexia and



Reading Plus intervention programs. Reading Plus candidates are in grades 4-6 (60 total) and must have a 3rd grade foundational reading level. Lexia candidates are in 3rd grade (20 total) and have a range of abilities and needs. We are optimistic about the opportunities that these programs will offer for our students.

- The annual mumkin fundraiser was another huge success with approximately 1532 mumkins being sold bringing in a profit of close to \$7000. These funds are imperative to the many student incentive programs taking place at LES. Thanks to everyone for their support.
- We are pleased to announce that Lincoln Elementary School's score on the K-PREP State Test from the spring of 2015 was a 66.0 (proficiency mark was a 66.2). Our achievement score increased from 63.5 to 66.0. Our gap score decreased from 43.7 to 42.4 and growth went from 64.5 to 61.6. Lincoln's overall score of a 66.0 was two tenths of a point short of being labelled as a proficient school. We will continue to work hard and make intentional decisions when challenging and growing all students at Lincoln Elementary School.
- The teachers at Lincoln have been working very hard on the requirements of the Teacher Professional Growth and Effectiveness System. Teachers have compiled and submitted their Student Growth Goal data to the school administration. The school administration along with the assistance of Mr. Wolf has been meeting with the teachers to discuss their teacher generated rubrics and possible next steps. The school administration has also begun the evaluation process of conducting mini-observations in the classrooms.
