

Lincoln Elementary School "Home of the Little Devils" Board Report for November 18, 2015

- ❖ The 2015 K-PREP test scores were discussed and analyzed at the SBDM meeting on 10/28. Explanations were given regarding our Achievement, GAP, and Growth along with the individual breakdown for each grade level. LES's overall score of 66.0 ranks us in the 69th percentile in the state of Kentucky. An overall score of 66.2 was the cutoff mark for being classified as a proficient school.
- Students in grades 3-6 participated in the first round of K-PREP scrimmage testing the week of 10/26. Students had to complete the cold assessments for reading and math within the allotted time restrictions. LES teachers continue to use a program called Gradecam and document cameras to assist in analyzing various assessments in a timely manner. All teachers in grades 3-6 met with the school administration and Mr. Wolf on 11/5 to discuss the scrimmage testing results and next steps to help promote student growth.
- ❖ "Students of the Month" (grades 4-6) for September were treated to pizza with the principals on 10/23 for their good behavior, attendance, and grades. We are very proud of these students and the examples that they are setting for their peers at LES. We are also very thankful to Joseph and Matthew Frommeyer, owners of Buona Vita Pizzeria, for agreeing to sponsor this student incentive program for the 6th year in a row.
- "Stars of the Month" (grades K-3) for September enjoyed pancakes with the principals on 11/6. We are very fortunate to have McDonald's sponsor this entire student incentive program for the 5th year in a row.
- ❖ The staff participated in a school-wide professional development day on Monday, 11/2. The teachers were divided into vertical teams to brainstorm ideas for the six goals of our revised CSIP. The revised CSIP will focus on the following areas: Reading Proficiency, Math Proficiency, Writing Proficiency, Program Reviews, Parent/Community Involvement, and Instructional Practices/Support Systems. Teachers collaborated to identify specific strategies and activities that will be the key components of our revised CSIP. Teachers also worked in grade level teams to finalize new RTI groups for reading



and math, analyzed KPREP scrimmage test results using Gradecam, and discussed academic trends that need to be addressed in the near future.

- ❖ Students in grades K-12 attended the Veteran's Day Celebration on 11/11 at Dayton High School. Students in grades 4-6 participated in a poem contest with the grade level winners reading their responses aloud during the ceremony. There were also students in grades K-3 who lead the assembly in the Pledge of Alliance.
- School administration has devised a plan to address students in grades 3-6 who are not meeting academic expectations for the 2015-2016 school year. Any student who currently has a "Contract to Pass" with the school counselors will be expected to participate in the ESS program beginning on 11/9. Teachers have also targeted other students who will be expected to attend ESS based on their academic performance thus far in the classroom.
