Professional Learning Consortium: The PL Consortium met on November 20th and discussed professional learning opportunities. The focus of the PL Consortia for the 2015-2016 will be to plan and design opportunities: One specific need already identified is beginning PLCs for specific groups. This may be a critical area that we can get "moving" right away for the region.

- 1. Dr. Detwiler has volunteered to be the PLC lead for the Arts and Humanities PLC. We will be meeting with NKU and Kennedy Arts to partner for regional needs/professional learning of this group.
- 2. It was a consensus that this group would like to meet every month vs. 4 times a year. This would allow topics to be addressed beyond professional learning needs that the group identifies and also would provide a way to "grow" from each other's knowledge and experiences. We also elected Chad Molley as chair of the group and he will work with the reps from each district to set the monthly agenda.
- 3. NGSS Leadership Academy: I am working with regional/state experts to put together a leadership NGSS 101 workshop for our region in February/March.
- 4. We need to also discuss in-depth summer needs (i.e. would a regional summer academy help in meeting teacher needs?) One consensus was the need to do a "new teacher boot camp" in late August/September.

NASCAR and NASA Partnership: Dr. Detwiler and I had a conference call with NASA and they are working to create professional learning events for our region. The culminating event for teachers and students who participate will be a ticket to Speedway (\$150.00value). Here are the tentative dates 4-6pm ET:

Gifted and Talented: NKCES was approached by NKAGE to discuss the potential for NKCES to oversee NKAGE. The regional kick-off meeting will be December 17th and we encourage all districts to have representation (we would love to have 100% representation to show our support of NKAGE's work in our region for students).

Dr. Reed has initiated a meeting with NKCES and NKU to explore the possibility of a collaboration effort on grant. The group has met several times to discuss goals/targets as this grant has a short turn-around.

Content Leadership Networks: Content Leadership Networks in Science and Social Studies in addition to ISLN are currently underway and are coordinated through NKCES for KDE.
