

Using the 125% Rule: If the district serves a school with less than 35% low-income, the per pupil amount must be multiplied by 125% for all schools served. Minimum per pupil amount must be calculated before funds are set-aside & must be used to calculate school allocations. The formula will calculate the Minimum Per Pupil Amount.

Note: If district serves only schools 35% or above low-income, it is not required to use the 125% rule

To ensure timely and meaningful consultation, the district Title I Coordinator must consult with the appropriate private school officials through the design, implementation and assessment of the Title I program for private school students. Consultation must include the following:

- The method or sources of data that are used to determine the number of children from low-income families in participating school attendance areas that attend private schools.
- 2. What criteria will be used to select eligible students for Title I services.
- 3. How the needs of the identified students will be identified.
- The size and scope of the equitable services to be provided to participating Title I students and the proportion of funds that is allocated for Title I services.
- 5. What Title I services will be provided to participating students.
- How and when the district will make a decision about the Title I services.
- 7. How, when, and by whom the district will deliver equitable services to participating Title I students, their families and teachers, including a thorough consideration and analysis of the views of the private school officials on the provision of Title I services through a contract with potential third-party providers.
- How the services will be academically assessed and how the results of that assessment will be used to improve those services.
- 9. How, if the district disagrees with the views of the private school officials on the provision of Title I services through a contract, the district will provide in writing to the private school officials an analysis of the reasons why the district has chosen not to use a third-party contractor
