

INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS/TEXTBOOK PLANS

BACKGROUND: KDE regulations required SBDM Councils to approve a purchasing plan for the use of these funds and those plans, in turn, must be approved by the board of education and then kept on file. According to board policy, instructional resource means “any print, non-print, or electronic medium of instruction designed to assist students.”

RATIONALE: As noted above, the board is required to approve school instructional materials plans before schools can use these state grant funds under 704 KAR 3:455.

PROPOSAL: Approve plans as approved and presented by each school’s SBDM committee.
