

Lincoln Elementary School "Home of the Little Devils" Board Report for January 27, 2016

- Literacy continues to be a point of emphasis at LES. Our students have currently read a total of 9797 AR books compared to 5947 at this time last year. There were also 219 students who met their AR goal for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of school and participated in the AR incentive on 1/11 and 1/13. Preschool's "Book of the Week" program has also been well received by our families as we continue to build the connection between the school and home. We have currently distributed approximately 600 books to our students and their families.
- The winter MAP data for students in grades K-6 looks promising in the subject areas of reading and math. We are currently at 44% of our students scoring at or above grade level in reading while 45% of our students scored at or above grade level in math.
- LES has six teachers along with teachers from other NKY districts participating in the Next Generation STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Classroom Project during the 2015-16 school year. The remaining sessions are 2/10, 2/23 (middle school only), and 4/26 (K-2 only).
- Teachers have input all of their Student Growth Goal information into the CIITS program and have been analyzing student performance data. The school administration will be collaborating with teachers to discuss student progress for the mid-year reviews.
- The ESS program for students in grades 3-6 has been up and running since 11/9. Students will continue to attend tutoring on a weekly basis to receive the appropriate instructional interventions. The counselors have also met with all students who failed a class for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of school to develop "Contracts to Pass."
- The second round of Advisory Team Meetings (ATM's) were held on 1/21, 1/22, and 1/25. The basis of these meetings is to look at students who are receiving appropriate interventions and develop next steps in promoting student growth.



- The next round of K-PREP Scrimmage Testing will take place on 1/27 and 1/28. Students will be answering multiple choice, short answer, and extended response questions that mimic those to be on the actual K-PREP Tests in May. Teachers will be utilizing Gradecam to analyze the data and will meet with the school administration on 2/11 to discuss trends and next steps.
- \* "Students of the Month" (grades 4-6) for December and January will be treated to pizza with the principals on 2/19 for their good behavior, attendance, and grades. "Stars of the Month" (grades K-3) for December and January will enjoy pancakes with the principals on 1/29 and 2/26 for staying on green, attending school, and working hard in the classroom.
- Extracurricular activities at LES continue to thrive with students participating in the following areas: academic team, chess club, robotics, wresting club, drama club, basketball, and 21<sup>st</sup> Century Grant. The chess club just completed their gathering with students from Ft. Thomas and Bellevue on 1/15. The drama club has chosen their cast members for the upcoming spring performance on 4/22 and 4/23. The academic team is currently undefeated after knocking off Latonia Elementary and Mary A. Goetz Elementary.
