Nelson County High School's Current CSIP was adopted FY 16

Goal 1 coordinated with YSC CPP: To increase the number of students at Nelson County High School who will make healthy choices and participate in wellness activities.

YSC will schedule one large event for students to participate in physical activity. Examples of events: Zumba, self-defense classes, etc.

YSC will partner with Feed America program to offer healthy choices in the Backpack Program meals sent home on Friday for low income students.

YSC will support with Suicide Prevention lesson given to all staff and students.

Goal 2 coordinated with YSC CPP: To increase the graduation rate from 93.7 to 94 in 2015-2016.

Credit recovery will be offered during the instructional day for students in need of credit recovery. YSC will coordinate with Admin and Credit Recovery teacher to find tutoring help for students who struggle material.

Goal 1 coordinated with YSC CPP: Increase the average freshman graduation rate from 72.4% in 2012 to 74.7% in 2015.

We will engage in a WIT academic recovery process with all students that have an F at each mid-term. This process will include parent contacts, meeting in a small group and one-on-one with the counselors, and receiving on-going monitoring by the house team. YSC will conduct monthly one on one monitoring with students that are consistently flagged in the WIT Recovery Matrix who are failing classes and behind on credits.

High School administrators and counselors will conduct credit audit meeting with all at risk students a minimum of two times a year. This audit will be placed in future story portfolios by the end of the year. YSC will support guidance counselors and admin with Future Story meetings with parents and students.
