#### **Review Item:**

Teach for America Update

## Rationale:

Board members requested more information on Teach for America in Kentucky.

# **Applicable Statute or Regulation:**

KRS 161.048

#### **History/Background:**

Existing Policy: The Kentucky General Assembly, under KRS 161.048, has enacted alternative routes to teacher and administrator certification for persons who have demonstrated exceptional work and/or educational experiences. The Education Professional Standards Board (EPSB) is the state agency that establishes standards and procedures for the alternative route options. The EPSB provides technical assistance to qualifying individuals who have potential as educators in Kentucky schools, to local boards of education, and to institutions of higher education in implementing these options.

- Option 1: Exceptional Work Experience Certification
- Option 2: Local District Training Program Certification
- Option 3: College Faculty Certification
- Option 4: Adjunct Instructor Certification
- Option 5: Veterans of the Armed Forces
- Option 6: University-Based Alternative Route to Certification
- Option 7: Institute Alternative Route to Certification
- Option 8: Teach for America (TFA) Alternative Route to Certification

**Summary:** The focus of this item is Option 8, Teach for America (TFA). TFA is a nationwide non-profit organization focused on closing achievement gaps among students in low-income areas. It allows a person in a field other than education to receive a one-year Temporary Provisional Certificate (elementary, middle, and/or secondary) renewable for a maximum of three years (first issuance, renewal, renewal) if he/she has met the following conditions:

- Holds a bachelor's degree;
- Has an offer of employment from a local school district in the area of certification being sought;
- Meets the participation criteria for the TFA program;

- Successfully completes all training requirements of the TFA program; and
- Passes all content assessments required by EPSB in the area of certification being sought.

TFA teachers complete the Kentucky Teacher Internship Program (KTIP) during year three.
