Dear Esteemed SBDM and Board of Education Members,

Tonight I present for your approval a trip to Costa Rica for all interested students who have previously been enrolled or are currently enrolled in a face-to-face Spanish class (any level) here at Spencer County High School. I attempted to fill out the School Related Student Trip Request Form to the best of my ability, but there are several details that have yet to be solidified, and can't be determined until approval for the trip is granted and the planning process can really begin. These details include the departure and arrival times, the number of students, the number of faculty sponsors and other chaperones, and the names of other adults that would be accompanying students on the trip. I'm writing this letter to elaborate on some of the details that can't be explained on the form and to explain to you what I envision for this trip, in order to help you make the most informed decision possible.

To begin, I would like to introduce the tour to you. We would be traveling with EF Tours, an esteemed and accredited tour company that has led educational tours for more than 50 years. The tour I have selected is entitled "Costa Rica: A Touch of the Tropics" and is a nine-day tour that visits several cities in Costa Rica. Some highlights of the tour include visiting the Arenal volcano, kayaking across Lake Arenal, going horseback riding in Monteverde, hiking among the clouds in the Santa Elena Cloud Forest, visiting a butterfly sanctuary in the Rainforest Adventures Park, taking a boat tour for an up-close look at life in the rivers of the Manuel Antonio National Park, planting trees in an effort to promote sustainability, and visiting a local school where the students will be welcomed with traditional dances. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for our students, and I'm happy to possibly offer them this chance.

I would also like to explain the finances behind this trip. The total cost for each student (if we take at least 35 students) would be \$2,505. This price includes round trip airfare from Louisville and on tour transportation, hotels with private bathrooms, three meals per day, a full time, bilingual Tour Director (who would be with us 24/7), entrance fees for tours and attractions, and Global Travel Protection Insurance. This price also includes a free chaperone for every six students who enroll. In order to help the students afford the trip, I am planning to do at least one fundraiser per month beginning in August (assuming this trip gets SBDM approval in May, Board approval in June, and we begin signing students up in August). Although I am not 100% sure what these fundraisers would be, I would make sure that they are profitable enough to be worth the kids' time and effort.

I hope this letter has better explained my vision for this student trip to Costa Rica, and I hope it has given you the insight you need to grant us the approval to begin moving forward with this amazing opportunity for our students. Also attached to this letter is a proposal from EF Tours for our specific tour, with important information highlighted. If you need additional information from me, please do not hesitate to ask. I will be happy to explain anything in more detail, answer any questions that I can, and find any answers that I don't know.


