**Applicable Statute or Regulation:** KRS 162.90 Powers and duties of the Local Board of Education.

Fiscal/Budgetary Impact: None

History/Background: The purpose of this agreement between the Floyd County Board of education and the Big Sandy Area Community Action Head Start Program is to coordinate services to eligible children through state (Kentucky Preschool) and federal (Head Start) funds. The agreement is based on the planned growth criteria set by the Kentucky Board of Education in conjunction with Head Start in January 1994 regarding local school district requirements for full utilization of Head Start in Kentucky.

The commitments outlined in the document are made to assure full utilization of Head Start funds by meeting the following objectives: (1) To avoid use of state dollars to supplant existing federal funds that are currently being used to provide services to children. (2) To avoid an increase in state dollars to serve more Head Start eligible children unless a Head Start Director certifies that no Head Start funds are available to serve those eligible children. (3) To maximize Head Start funding for services to economically disadvantaged four-year-old children and to three and four-year-old children with disabilities.

# LOCAL AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATION ON FULL UTILIZATION OF HEAD START SCHOOL YEAR 2016-2017

Head Start grantees are required to submit this local agreement to Region IV Office of Head Start and the Kentucky Head Start Collaboration Office.

#### Purpose:

The purpose of this agreement between the <u>Floyd County</u> Board of Education and the <u>Big Sandy Community Action</u> Head Start Program is to coordinate services to eligible children through state (Kentucky Preschool) and federal (Head Start) funds. The agreement is based on the planned growth criteria set by the Kentucky Board of Education in conjunction with Head Start in January 1994 regarding local school district requirements for full utilization of Head Start in Kentucky.

The commitments outlined in the document are made to assure full utilization of Head Start funds by meeting the following objectives: (1) To avoid use of state dollars to supplant existing federal funds that are currently being used to provide services to children. (2) To avoid an increase in state dollars to serve more Head Start eligible children unless a Head Start Director certifies that no Head Start funds are available to serve those eligible children. (3) To maximize Head Start funding for services to economically disadvantaged four-year-old children and to three and four-year-old children with disabilities.
