G.1.a. Teacher Representative: Jennifer Rodabaugh - Lansdowne Elementary

Jennifer Rodabaugh is currently a STEAM lab teacher at Lansdowne Elementary. She has been an employee of the Fayette County Public School system since 2008. G.2.a. Performance, Beaumont Middle Orchestra

Beaumont Middle School Orchestra. The eighth-grade orchestra boasts 30 members and a strong sense of musicality. They have earned the Kentucky Music Education Association's "distinguished" rating for three years. Currently, three of these students are members of the Central Kentucky Youth Orchestra and three are members of the KMEA Honors Orchestra. Eight members participated in KMEA Solo and Ensemble and received "distinguished" ratings. In addition, the average GPA of this group is 3-point-7. These orchestra students are under the direction of Cindy Higgins.

G.3.a. Recognition, Theodore Ehrenborg, Henry Clay High School, Winner, 2016 Secretary of State Essay Contest

Henry Clay High School's Theodore Ehrenborg was the ninth-grade winner in the Secretary of State's annual essay contest. This competition was established in 1988 to inspire students to be active and informed citizens, with particular emphasis on election-related issues. This year, students were invited to write about the First Amendment and the role that news media play in elections. Theodore received a \$1,000 scholarship for his state-level success.

A group of Lafayette High School students earned first-place honors in the annual Macauley Chamber Music Competition, which was hosted by the University of Louisville's School of Music. The Tick Tock Trio includes Madison Jones on violin, Herman Bratcher on horn, and Carson Crovo on piano. They also performed a Brahms piece during a live in-studio program on the W-U-O-L radio station. These young musicians were guided by Lafayette orchestra director Phil Kent.

Winburn Middle School's William Ding, Dylan Li, Lohith Tummala, and Lynn Ye earned second-place team honors in Kentucky's 2016 MATHCOUNTS competition. Lohith finished fourth overall and won a four-year, full-tuition scholarship to either the University of Kentucky or the University of Louisville. He also receives an expenses-paid trip to the MATHCOUNTS national competition next month in Washington D.C., where he will represent Kentucky. Dylan placed fifth among individuals at state, and William was ninth. Both won four-year \$1,500 scholarships. MATHCOUNTS is a national coaching and competition program designed to develop and strengthen math, science, leadership, and teamwork skills.

G.3.d. Recognition, Several Winners, 2016 Governor's Cup

Rosa Parks Elementary was the overall runner-up in Region 20 of Governor's Cup, and tied for second in Future Problem Solving. These youngsters are coached by Sangeeta Kadambi. Rosa Parks students bringing home individual honors were: Lance Hixson, first place in Social Studies; Bailey Zhu, first place in Language Arts; and Camden Richardson, second place in Science.

Ashland Elementary placed first in the quick recall portion. Students bringing home individual honors were: Max Ederington, first place in Math, and Phoenix DuBravac, first place in Science. Ashland is coached by Kelsey Laborio and Melodie Vareen. Maxwell Elementary tied for second in Future Problem Solving with the team of Landon Hodge, Jack Hollingshead, Zach Oliver, and Evelyn Real, and Evan Paden placed second in Composition. They are coached by Rachel Matthews and Lauren Murphy. Other individual elementary winners in the Governor's Cup were: Evan Covert from Liberty, first place in Composition; Derek Hollifield from Dixie, second place in Math; and Logan Dievert from Wellington, second place in Social Studies.

In the middle school division of Governor's Cup, Winburn was the overall runner-up and placed second in the Quick Recall portion of the state-level competition in Louisville. This academic team is coached by Robyn Wilson and Sangeeta Kadambi. In the high school division of Governor's Cup, Tates Creek was runner-up in Future Problem-Solving in the state competition. Miles Dunn, Gabriel Garcia, Griffin Gensheimer, and Brianna Stanley, they are coached by Kristina Trimble. Other individual high school winners were: Joanna Slusarewicz from Paul Laurence Dunbar, second place in Composition; and Adil Yusuf of Dunbar, second place in Science.

Paul Laurence Dunbar High School secured the KHSAA boys' basketball championship with a 61-to-52 victory over Doss in title game at Rupp Arena. Taveion Hollingsworth, who tallied 20 points and eight rebounds, was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Jordan Lewis and Darius Williams joined Taveion on the all-tournament team, and Vincent "Earl" Clark received the Ted Sanford Award. Ranked Number One for much of the season, Dunbar was favored in the Sweet Sixteen. The Bulldogs' school-record 33rd win marked their first state championship. Dunbar, which opened in 1990, also reached the finals in 1993 and 1994. Led by head coach Scott Chalk, Dunbar is the first Lexington public school to win the state basketball title since Lafayette in 2001. Scott was also named 2016 Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year.
