Action/Consent Item:

Kentucky Writing Program Advisory Committee Appointment

Commissioner's Recommendation:

The Commissioner recommends that Kimberly Mucker Johnson be appointed to the Kentucky Writing Program Advisory Committee.

Rationale:

To fill a seat on the Writing Program Advisory Committee, an appointment is necessary. The proposed member has expertise in the areas of writing instruction and/or professional learning. With the approval of this new member, the composition of the Writing Program Advisory Committee will continue to represent all areas of the state and all levels of education (elementary, middle, secondary and postsecondary) in addition to representing gender and racial diversity.

Action Question:

Should the Kentucky Board of Education approve the recommendation for the appointment to the Kentucky Writing Program Advisory Committee?

Applicable Statute or Regulation:

KRS 158.770, KRS 158.775

History/Background:

Existing Policy: According to KRS 158.770, the Kentucky Board of Education shall appoint the members of an advisory committee on writing to make recommendations to the board on methods of integrating writing into the curriculum, teacher training programs and workshops designed to facilitate the effective teaching of writing, and use of funds allotted for teacher professional learning and Kentucky Writing Project grants through the Kentucky Writing Program. The majority of the membership shall be educators currently employed by local school districts or public universities.

The Kentucky Writing Project State Network members nominate committee members. Because the Kentucky Writing Program incorporates various platforms for the delivery of professional learning, it is important that all platforms be represented on the Writing Program Advisory Committee. It also is essential that committee members understand

the necessity of writing professional learning and the components of research-based professional learning in the field of writing.

Since the passage of Senate Bill 1 (2009), the work of the writing advisory committee has been directed toward the implementation of the Kentucky Academic Standards and Program Reviews in writing.

Summary: The following individual is recommended for appointment:

1. Dr. Kimberly Mucker Johnson – Jefferson County Public Schools

Dr. Kimberly Mucker Johnson has a Bachelor of Arts in Humanities (1996) from the University of Louisville, a Master of Arts in Teaching (2003) from Spalding University and a Doctor of Education in Education Leadership (2007) from Spalding University. She has been an educator for over fourteen years in Kentucky and has taught English/ language arts and social studies in Jefferson County Public Schools. Dr. Johnson is currently an instructional coach with both school and district coaching responsibilities in Jefferson County.

Dr. Johnson’s professional affiliations include the National Writing Project, International Literacy Association, Kentucky Reading Association, Greater Louisville Reading Council and the Learn Zillion Dream Team. She has facilitated numerous presentations on topics such as resiliency, speaking and listening, and argumentative writing. Dr. Johnson is the author of a children’s book and she co-authored a professional development book titled, “What Did You Learn Today?: Implementing Family Message Journals K-12.”
