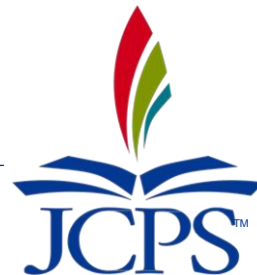

On behalf of the Jefferson County Board of Education, we would like to express our support for the proposal that Louisville become the next Say Yes to Education community, to be submitted by a partnership of leading community, government, and educational organizations. We believe that Say Yes to Education can help us achieve the district's strategic vision, that "all JCPS students graduate prepared, empowered, and inspired to reach their full potential and contribute as thoughtful, responsible citizens of our diverse, shared world."

The unique components in the Say Yes Theory of Action provides Louisville a coherent governance framework for effective decision-making, a clear roadmap for aligned collective action, and a compelling message to inspire children, families, and the entire community to dream big and strive toward a better future. The key components of Say Yes include: 100% college tuition scholarships for high school graduates; deep cross-government and service sector collaboration and governance; strategic use of data; and comprehensive supports for students, all leading to increased postsecondary completion.

We believe that the Say Yes initiative will allow our city to build upon the strong history of collaboration that already exists and increase our effectiveness in reaching our community-wide education goals. Through 55,000 Degrees, Greater Louisville, Inc. has made a collective education commitment of adding 55,000 postsecondary degrees by the year 2020. Jefferson County Public Schools, leading one of the four pillars of the Louisville Cradle to Career Framework, plays an integral role to achieving that goal.

The Jefferson County Board of Education commits to working collaboratively with Say Yes to Education and all of our community partners, to engage in the process of developing a long-term, sustainable plan of action aligned with the Say Yes Framework, and to implement it with fidelity. There will be challenges along the way, but working together, as one community with common purpose, we believe we can transform the futures for our children and our city.

We hope that the Say Yes Board of Directors will select Louisville as its next partnership community, and we look forward to our continuing partnership to bring this vitally important endeavor to fruition.
