

Ukeru is about receiving, engaging, sensing, feeling and responding to what someone is trying to communicate to through actions, while maintaining the safety of all involved.





Less Restraints and Money Saved

In 2004 Grafton had over 1,500 seclusions and over 6,600 restraints across our organization. Today, while serving over 150 highly acute and complex consumers each day, we have **eliminated seclusion** across the organization while **reducing the use of physical restraints company-wide by 99.8%**.

Interestingly, since these changes have been made internally, we have **saved over \$5.5** million in staff turnover costs and **decreased client induced staff injuries by 62% for a total ROI of over \$15 million**.






ABOUT UKERU

- Ukeru was created onsite at Grafton Integrated Health Network, a private, nonprofit service provider for those overcoming emotional, behavioral or developmental challenges, as an alternative way to promote security and comfort while reducing the use of restraint and seclusion. The program is grounded in conceptual ideas such as trauma informed care, and conflict resolution, and supported by physical techniques that minimize the need for restraints and seclusion. Using soft Ukeru blocking pads, staff can protect both clients and themselves against aggressive episodes.

ACT Bootcamps


Males of Color attend a workshop for ACT preparation. The students that have attended have improved an average of 2 points on the ACT
