Marion and Washington Counties are unquestionably unique. Although they lack the advantage of direct access to an Interstate Highway system, the two communities have managed to build an unprecedented concentration of Manufacturing and Health Care Jobs in rural Central Kentucky unlikely found anywhere else in Kentucky. How was this enviable record achieved? Clearly, through innovative solutions to employers' educational training and career needs that are integral to attracting, retaining, and developing the most productive, dependable workforce. Public support is needed as our communities strive to meet the demands of constant advances in technology and needed training for jobs of the future. Our plan will improve the current void of training accessibility and lack of skilled and semi-skilled workers. Grant monies would be used to create a Central Kentucky Advanced Workforce District made up of the surrounding workforce drawing counties with the goal of improving the pool of quality applicants for highly skilled jobs through programming changes for traditional and non-traditional students and a revolutionary outreach training to inmates. Grant monies would be used for the purchasing of a 24/7 mobile learning lab(bus)/training center to improve access to training opportunities. The bus would also be a marketing tool equipped with a moving billboard for advertising and branding community workforce needs. Grant monies will also be used to extend the Area Technology Center with classroom clusters to include core teachers (i.e. math, science & English) and technical teachers to create an environment of a comprehensive technical high school. A soft skills and project-based learning curriculum would be intentionally integrated for a seamless transition to dual credit opportunities through ECTC, industry certifications, internships and co-ops. Lastly, an extensive marketing campaign will be implemented to ensure success.

Soft Skills Training (Resume writing, 5S (sort, set in order, shine, standardize, and sustain), drug free zones, attendance & punctuality, professional etiquette) and Project-Based Learning (Student & Community based partnerships, student centric projects management skills, team problem solving and culture of passion-driven success) will be paramount to all sectors.

Training on manufacturing processes and innovative technologies to improve products will affect all sectors (Advanced Manufacturing, Health Science, Transportation & Logistics, Business & IT Services, and Construction & Trades).

Training that meets the current demands of the communities such as Welding, FANUC Robotics, Industrial Maintenance or other needs with Advanced Manufacturing.

Professional development training for teachers with project-based learning and a soft-skills curriculum. Training for teachers in cross-curricular connections for making connections to career pathway.

What are the private sector demand estimates for the proposed training?

Private sector demands are immediate in order for Central Kentucky to be uniquely competitive in today's global economy. Marion County alone will need training opportunities to consistently update its current 4000 manufacturing employee workforce. The training demand far exceeds our ability for accessible training opportunities for workers. For continued prosperity, Central Kentucky is at a critical point of finding training solutions. Our partners reports that 75% to 100% of their employees will need some type of update training to meet the demands of advances in technology across all 5 sectors. Soft skills training ranks high on all lists with 100% of prospective employees needing training in this area.
