## 2008-2009 East Hardin Middle School Section 7 Request

The East Hardin Middle School SBDM council understands that Section 7 funds are surplus monies that have not otherwise been earmarked for a specific expenditure and due to budgetary predictions, funds for school year 2008 – 2009 will most likely be non-existent or at best, less than in years past. The SBDM council, in collaboration with the Instructional Committee, has considered each of the items below based on how they will effect instruction, culture, and climate for the East Hardin community of learners. We have ranked these requests in order of greatest need so that if funds become available, the higher priority items are more easily recognized.

#### **Facilities Needs**

- 1. Complete the resurfacing of our parking lots. The areas beside the technology education building and football field were not paved when the bus loading and unloading sections were done. In addition to being a safety concern, we feel that resurfacing will add value to the culture and climate of EHMS. A request will be made to the Hardin County Road Department to repave the boundary roads that access East Hardin if we resurface the remainder of our parking area at the school. (\$22,000.00 Estimated)
- 2. Due to routine replacement of furniture for instructional purposes, East Hardin requests \$4.00 per student to aid in furniture purchases for the 2008-2009 school year. (\$2,800.00)

### **Staffing Needs**

We are respectfully asking that additional consideration be given to the request made by all middle schools two years ago. Allotting a band director to each school WITHOUT counting against our yearly teacher allocation would alleviate unnecessary cuts in staffing, because this is NOT a position that can be eliminated. Doing so would allow for continued focus on school-wide goals of increasing student achievement and maintaining consistency while addressing the affective needs of middle school students through interdisciplinary teaming. (\$40,000.00 Estimated)

#### **Instructional Needs**

1. East Hardin Middle School receives only \$49.00 (give or take a little) per student from the state to purchase adopted textbooks. Hardin County's three high schools currently receive \$65.00 per student from Section 7 funds for the purchase of, in many cases, the same adopted textbooks. Middle Schools come up short on textbook money every year and must resort to purchasing only classroom sets of books rather than one per students. Even with that reduction in the number of books purchased, we have to use our Board Allocated Funds to make up the difference. We are requesting \$15.00 per student as supplemental textbook support. This amount would be roughly the difference between the textbook allocation that we get from the state and what the district provides our high schools. (\$10,500.00)

- 2. Our school-owned band instruments are in horrible physical condition. The portion of Board Allocated Funds channeled to the band program along with the money they earn through fundraisers is normally enough to sustain their annual expenditures on sheet music, travel and instrument maintenance, but not enough to allow for instrument replacement. The cost of a French Horn is roughly \$2500.00 and a Tuba is in the \$2000.00 range. Section 7 funds, in the amount of \$25.00 per student enrolled, are allocated to all three Hardin County high schools as a band/fee replacement support. We are requesting \$15.00 per BAND STUDENT as a supplement to our program that would allow for the purchase of at least one replacement instrument per year. This request is made so that our band programs may be brought somewhat in-line with funding that's provided to the high schools those programs that our students will feed into and support. (\$2500.00)
- 3. Thoughtful Education is an instructional program that provides strategies to increase student learning. East Hardin will participate in the Thoughtful Education initiative for the 2008-2009 school year. The Instructional Services Department of the Hardin County Board of Education will oversee the implementation. (\$8,760.00)
- 4. The Hardin County Board of Education has provided funding for academic field trip expenditures through Section 7 monies. East Hardin is requesting academic field trip reimbursement for 2008-2009 in the amount of \$2.00 per student. (\$1,400.00)
- 5. The Hardin County Board of Education has provided funding for competitive field trip expenditures through Section 7 monies. East Hardin is requesting competitive field trip reimbursement for 2008-2009 in the amount of \$3.00 per student. (\$2,100.00)

# SECTION 7 REQUEST RATIONALE JAMES T. ALTON MIDDLE SCHOOL

The James T. Alton Middle School SBDM Council is aware of the proposed cuts in education for the 2008-09 school year. Keeping this in mind, we are submitting our Section 7 Request with the hope that additional funding will be allocated and as a result, our requests given consideration.

#### FACILITIES:

- 1. With the influx of students and families anticipated with BRAC, first impressions will be lasting. The parking lots at Alton are in need of resealing in order to maintain the exterior appearance of our facility.
- 2. Due to continual growth and routine replacement of furniture (i.e. student desks) for instructional purposes, we are respectfully requesting \$4.00 per student to assist with these purchases.
- 3. In anticipation of on-line testing, along with increased scheduling of our current computer labs, we are renovating the Family/Consumer Science classroom into a computer lab. Assistance is needed for countertops, construction, etc.
- 4. As stated, our girl's/boy's basket ball uniforms are in need of replacement.

#### STAFFING:

1. See rationale stated on request.

#### **INSTRUCTIONAL NEEDS:**

- 1. The Hardin County Board of Education has previously provided funding for academic and non-academic field trip expenditures. We are respectfully requesting that this practice continue in order to supplement the costs associated with school trips.
- 2. Currently middle schools receive approximately \$49.00 per student for textbook adoption. Since middle schools do not have adequate funding for this expenditure, we are forced to use other resources and often resort to purchasing classroom sets only. (Our current proposal for science textbook adoption is approximately \$65.00 per student.) With the proposed \$15.00 allocation from the board, this would assist in off setting costs.

- 3. Our school-owned band instruments are in poor condition and in frequent need of repair. Band students must fundraise on a yearly basis in order to sustain annual expenditures; however, this is not always enough to allow for instrument replacement. This request is being made so that our band program can maintain the level of proficiency expected by our feeder high schools.
- 4. Since technology is a standard that teachers are evaluated on, and is a skill needed for 21<sup>st</sup> century learners, we must provide schools with computer resources. Currently, Alton has funded the majority of these housed in our building and we are working toward the goal of one per classroom.
- 5. Being involved in Thoughtful Education this year has allowed our teachers access to best practice instructional strategies. If monies are allocated to middle schools for this purpose, we would like this opportunity provided to us in order to continue this practice.

### 2008-2009 Radcliff Middle School Section 7 Fund Request

Our SBDM council has discussed the merit of various needs that RMS has and the potential impact on student achievement and school climate that accompany each need. We realize fully that a plan for a replacement school for RMS has been approved at the local level and submitted for state approval. With that in mind, we have limited our requests to areas of need that have significant impact on us now and will continue to have impact until we move and those needs that would still need to be fulfilled to make the RMS building more viable for future tenants.

#### Facilities needs

#### 1. Furniture:

We'd like to request \$2.00 per student for furniture needs. We are in need of new white marker boards for classrooms.

#### 2. Roof:

The roof over our gym still leaks, even after continual repairs. During a hard rain, we have 5 or more leaks that cause a safety hazard for students in the gym.

#### 3. Bleachers:

We have one section of bleachers in the gym that are broken. This, too, is a safety issue, especially during assembly programs and during basketball games when the bleachers are all needed.

#### 4. HVAC Unit:

Our band hallway area does not have adequate heating and cooling. A new HVAC unit is needed to ensure the comfort of the students and staff to help create an optimal learning environment.

#### 5. Gym Floor:

The floor in the gym needs to be repainted and resurfaced.

#### Parking Lot:

Our parking lot contains numerous large pot holes in need of repair and parking spaces in need of repainting.

#### 7. Stage area:

Our stage area needs to be remodeled and a new sound system needs to be installed for large gatherings.

### 8. Phone system:

Our phone system is too old to adequately interface with our new intercom system.

#### 9. Windows:

The windows in the classrooms found on the back side of our building leak, letting cold air and rain into the classroom. We would also like to replace the blinds with shades that are more uniform and are actually functional to give a more pleasing aesthetic look to parents and members of the community who approach the school from the back. We also have many window panes in the older portion of the building that are falling out. Luckily, there have only been minor student injuries.

#### Instructional needs

### 1. Band Instruments:

We are requesting \$5,000 to replace some of our old band instruments. Many of our instruments are over 10 years old, and most of our students due not have the financial means to buy or rent their own instruments.

### 2. Medical supplies: \$250

Again because of funding cuts to our YSC, we will need to absorb the costs of basic medical supplies for students.

#### 3. Student Field trip costs:

We ask that the funding of \$2.00 per student to cover field trips be maintained to give our students access to programs outside of school to enhance their learning.

### 4. Technology: \$2500

We would like to purchase 3 more CPS units to enhance instruction.

#### 5. Thoughtful Education: \$8760

We ask that money be allocated to fund Thoughtful Education as a means of ensuring that our teachers have varied skills for teaching our students in research-based, effective strategies and methodologies.

### 6. Transportation: \$350

Because we are the only middle school in the district without its own football field, we have incurred transportation costs for all of our football games. During the 2008-09 school year, North Hardin allowed us to use their practice field as our "home field," but we still incurred the cost of transporting students from RMS to North Hardin. We ask that funds to help defray the costs of lining North's field and transporting our students be allotted.

### **Staffing**

We request that the band director's position not be deducted from our teacher allocation since that position is mandated by the Board.

Thank you for your consideration of these requests and your continued support. Though we know that Radcliff Middle School has received some special consideration in funding in the past, please note that we are still the weakest link in the Hardin County Schools chain. We ask that you continue to support us under our new leadership so that we can make the gains necessary to advance and improve not only our organization but the Hardin County Schools organization. As we all know, "An organization is only as strong as its weakest link."
