Dual Credit Memorandum of Agreement between Northern Kentucky University and Boone County Schools

I. Purpose

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) establishes a collaborative relationship between Northern Kentucky University (NKU) and Boone County Schools to offer dual credit opportunities for secondary school students who meet the requirements for admission into NKU's School Based Scholars Program (SBS). This agreement incorporates by reference the stipulations included in Governor Matthew G. Bevin's Executive Order 2016-378, which established the Kentucky Dual Credit Scholarship (DCS) Program on June 24, 2016, and is managed by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

II. Registration Procedures

All students must be admitted to NKU and complete SBS application. To be admitted into NKU's SBS program, the students must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be a high school junior or senior.
- Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicants must have a composite ACT score of 20 or higher. Students who do not have an ACT score may also submit an equivalent SAT or PSAT score. If a student does not have an ACT, SAT, or PSAT score, they may be admitted with a 3.0 or higher GPA and recommendation from their high school guidance counselor.
- Applicants must meet any prerequisites for individual courses.

Once in the program, students must earn a grade of C or higher in each class to take courses in the next semester.

Boone County Schoolswill be responsible for transmitting all data required by the Kentucky DCS Program to KHEAA and following all procedures necessary to administer the DCS. NKU will be responsible for transmitting enrollment verification and final grade reports to KHEAA at the end of each semester, in accordance with the DCS procedures.

III. Approved Courses

The list of courses approved to be offered at Boone County Schools as dual credit during the 2016-2017 academic year were specified in an MOA between NKU and Boone County Schools signed prior to the start of the Fall 2016 semester. A signed copy of that agreement can be obtained by contacting the SBS Office (nkusbs@nku.edu). Additionally, students may take courses online or on an NKU campus.

NKU reserves the right to cancel a class that does not meet enrollment targets.

IV. Negotiated Costs

A. Tuition Rate

The tuition rate for all eligible attending SBS from any KY Public School system will be \$52 per credit hour, the Dual Credit Tuition Rate ceiling as prescribed within the Governor's Executive Order published June 24, 2016.

B. Related Course Expenses

According to the EO, "No additional fees may be charged by a PPI, including but not limited to special equipment charges, laboratory fees, and other additional charges".
