Action/Consent Item:

Kentucky Tech Policies and Procedures (state-operated area technology centers)

Commissioner's Recommendation

The Commissioner recommends that the board approve the amendments to the Kentucky Tech Policies and Procedures.

Rationale:

These policies guide the work of administrators, teachers, and staff in the 53 state-operated area technology centers. Their purpose is to ensure consistent practice that is compliant with relevant state and federal policy, regulations, and statutes.

Action Question:

Should the Kentucky Board of Education approve the proposed amendments within Chapter 9 of the Kentucky Tech Policies and Procedures Manual?

Applicable Statute or Regulation:

KRS 156.802 Office of Career and Technical Education – Kentucky Board of Education (Effective: June 25, 2013)

History/Background:

Existing Policy: The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) has the responsibility for all administrative functions of the state in relation to the management, control, and operation of state-operated secondary area technology centers. The secondary area technology centers shall be operated in compliance with program standards established by the Kentucky Board of Education.

Summary: In August of 2015, the Kentucky Board of Education approved the revised edition of the *KY Tech Policies and Procedures Manual*. The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) contracts with the Kentucky School Boards Association (KSBA) for annual maintenance, revision, and upkeep of these policies and procedures. Proposed amendments for the 2016-17 academic year are as follows (affected pages of the manual are attached):

A Chapter 9: Students

• 09.15 – STUDENT FEES. The amendments seek to accomplish the following:

- Clarify that there shall be no tuition or fees charged to secondary students enrolled in Kentucky's state-operated area technology centers and who are residents of Kentucky.
- Re-order the content, as to ensure that all information related to secondary students is presented first, then followed by postsecondary student information.
- Remove tuition and fee information related to KCTCS postsecondary students, as this information is subject to change often.
- Include the requirement of a criminal records request for all adult learners enrolled in a secondary area technology center.

Budget Impact: The proposed amendments to the Kentucky Tech Policies and Procedures have no fiscal impact on the agency.
