New accountability formula in spring of 2016

- ❖ Achievement, Gap, Growth (learners) all equal percentages
- ❖ AMO based on learners only, not total score as in years past
- ❖ AMO's increased by over 10 points for Southgate School in spring of 2016 (one of highest jumps in the state) due to high learners score in 2015; many districts saw a drop in their AMO due to lower learners scores
- ❖ Total 77% of accountability (Program Reviews 23%)

Part 2: Southgate Demographics

- 80% of ELE and 70% of MID grades students are in at least one gap group
- Grades 3-8 Gap Groups ranged from 55% to 78% of each class
 - ❖ 33% of student population is of a minority ethnicity
 - ❖ 70.7% of students are below the poverty level based on school lunch data (not all report)
 - ❖ 19.8% of students have an IEP or 504 (5% speech only)
- Grades 3-8 transiency ranged from 44% to 89% of each class
- From spring 2015 K-PREP to spring 2016 K-PREP turnover of 50 plus students. Over 60 P and D scores from 2015 didn't return in 2016
- Kindergarten Readiness has averaged below 40% with 26% readiness in Fall 2016
- 50% of RtI students (majority below 25th percentile on MAP assessment) for Fall 2016 are in first year at Southgate
- Teacher Turnover 53.3%...State average 17.8%

- 2015 revised Distinguished Cut Score
- Math-Middle Grades and 4th grade
- Program Reviews increased scores
- Attendance Rate higher than the state average
- Safe Schools Report shows little to no:
 - ❖ assaults
 - ❖ harassment
 - ❖ drugs, alcohol, tobacco
 - ❖ violence
 - ❖ weapons
- Progression from 8th percentile in 2012:
 - ❖ Proficient-once
 - ❖ Distinguished-once
 - ❖ High Progress School and District-twice
 - ❖ .9 from Proficient in 2016

Part 4: Biggest Challenges

- Over-coming Gap Group challenges
- Over-coming transiency challenges
- Over-coming staff transiency
- Over-coming time challenges at all levels, including administration
- Increased number of students with more severe disabilities
- Growing fast enough and far enough
