

IN THE LAST 10 YEARS

- 59% of the football championships have been won by 6 teams
- 54% boys basketball of the championships have been won by 7 teams
- 56% of the girls basketball championships have been won by 6 teams
- 66% of the girls volleyball championships have been won by 5 teams
- 82% of the boys water polo championships have been won by 3 teams

IN THE LAST 10 YEARS

- 86% girls water polo of the championships have been won by 5 teams
- 48% boys soccer of the championships have been won by 8 teams

The Louisiana High School Athletic <u>Assocation</u> will consider proposals this week to put public and private schools in different categories for sports.

LAFAYETTE, La. — For 15 years, a debate has brewed in Louisiana High School Athletic Association circles over whether to split the state into separate public and private school associations. Some public coaches and administrators believe private schools, with bigger pools of talent to draw from, have an unfair advantage.

Attempts to divide sports teams failed in 1998 and 2005. The discontented public school faction was down, but certainly not out.

At the annual LHSAA Convention today through Friday in Baton Rouge, two more proposals that would divide the state's school sports teams....



WHAT IS THE #1 ISSUE?

A LEVEL PLAYING FIELD FOR ALL SCHOOLS:

LARGE, MEDIUM, SMALL, PUBLIC, PRIVATE, CHARTER, HAVES, HAVE NOTS, ETC.

(AT LEAST AS MANY SCHOOLS AS POSSIBLE)

<u>STEPS</u>

- Identify Specific Sports
- Identify Factors For Evaluation
- Develop Power Rankings Formula
- Create Power Rankings and Divisions
 - Establish Deadlines and Timelines
 - Penalty for Missing Deadlines

IDENTIFY SPECIFIC SPORTS

Fall – Football, Girls Tennis, Girls Volleyball,
 Boys Water Polo

Winter – Boys/Girls Basketball, Boys/Girls
 Soccer, G Water Polo

Spring – Baseball, Softball, Boys Tennis,
 Boys Volleyball

<u>IDENTIFY FACTORS FOR EVALUATION</u>

Utilize 2 years of data, divisions change annually

- Regular Season Results Every Game!
- Strength of Schedule Using Formula
- Section Playoff Performance

DEVELOP POWER RANKINGS FORMULA

- All sports are not the same
- Sport Administrators can change the weight of each of the three factors to arrive at the best formula for that sport

CREATE POWER RANKINGS AND DIVISIONS

- Apply Formula
- Review Rankings, Adjust Formula as Needed
- Create Divisions of Competitive Schools

PENALTY FOR MISSING DEADLINES

 SCHOOLS WHO FAIL TO ACCURATELY ENTER FULL AND COMPLETE DATA WILL NOT BE PLACED INTO A PLAYOFF DIVISION FOR THE UPCOMING SEASON AND WILL BE INELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CIF SOUTHERN SECTION CHAMPIONSHIPS IN THAT SPORT

(Chase data from deadline date to Preview date)

GUARANTEED ENTRIES FROM LEAGUES

All Sports (Except Football):

4 Team Leagues = 2 Entries

5-6 Team Leagues = 3 Entries

7-8 Team Leagues = 4 Entries

(32-team brackets. If we have more than 32 guaranteed entries, we have Wild Card games to get to 32. If we have less, we fill with At-Large.)

ENTRIES FROM LEAGUES - FOOTBALL

4-5 Team Leagues = 2 Entries

6-8 Team Leagues = 3 Entries

9 or More Team Leagues = 4 Entries

(16-Team Brackets. League Champions have priority, 2nd Place next, 3rd Place next. Less than 16 entries, we fill with At-Large or if we have more, we cut teams using same At-Large process.)

THE "A WORD" – APPEALS

Appeals of divisional placements will only be considered regarding inaccurate information provided by schools. If that occurs, the affected school must send a written request to the Assistant Commissioner in charge of that sport seeking a reconsideration of their placement, based upon corrected information provided by the school.
