

Dual enrollment course-taking in Kentucky

Selected findings from the report, "Dual enrollment courses in Kentucky: High school students' participation and completion rates"*

In 2012/13, student participation in and completion of dual enrollment courses varied by free/reduced-price lunch eligibility.




In 2012/13, student participation in and completion of dual enrollment courses varied by district location.



Student participation in academic courses increased over four years.



Twenty-two percent of Kentucky students who completed dual enrollment courses earned at least 12 college credits (a full semester's worth) before graduation.
