Good News Report The high school was recognized at the Board of Education meeting for our test scores as well as at the South East South Central Co-op. 2nd round of CERT assessment was administered today and all went well. COMPASS is also being given this week and 7 more students are now college and career ready. KYOTE must be administered prior to Dec 2. Mr. Mayberry had some band students who were recognized in the region and district and who then went on to audition for places in the All State Band. Girls basketball won against Pulaski and the boys will play tonight at LCHS against Lafayette. Very first swim meet will be Thursday. Academic team has begun and has been 1-1 at both matches. First round of KTIP is now over. There are 9 KTIP teachers. Mrs. Manion's trip to Boston for the NADSFL and ACTFL conferences was a huge success.

- 5. New Business-December 8th. Student-led presentations of what has been happening in their classrooms. Times will be 6-8 p.m.
 - a. Staffing Update Linda Green began yesterday to replace Kevin Coontz as the new 21st century site coordinator. She will share out with staff tomorrow afternoon about her goals and vision for the program. We will have a posting for a Spanish position later this month. There will be a letter sent home to parents explaining the situation and informing parents and students of the current and future situation.
 - b. Plus Delta Mr Godbey got 15 responses total and 2 of the overwhelming responses were: 1) Red Zone and other schedules have caused a great deal of classroom interruptions. We will be working on providing remediation without disrupting the learning process so much. It was often commented that it created

- an 8 period day for students and teachers but was not long enough to be effective. 2) Standards Based Grading is still very inconsistent throughout the building and the admin team will continue working on supporting teachers with the process and improving the practice throughout the building.
- c. Student advisory: Mr Godbey met with the student advisory council and some of the items they discussed were: 1) Red Zone (they agreed it was a positive initiative but didn't think it was long enough and that teachers had mentioned being overwhelmed by all of the different schedules), Cafeteria (requested different/better food), Standards Based Grading (they like it overall, feel that retakes are positive. They feel that many teachers are implementing it nonuniformly and the students feel that not all teachers understand the process and that new teachers are overwhelmed.
- d. E-Meetings: The Board is moving towards allowing meetings to be held electronically/virtually to move into the 21st century and being green. It will be a great program that facilitates meetings, saves paper copies, and offers alternatives to physical meetings.
- e. Spring Semester course offering: National French Honor Society and National Spanish Honor Society students will begin the class offering next semester again where they travel to elementary schools and teach beginning world language courses. As for transportation, the board will cover the cost of the buses.
- f. Valedictorian/Salutatorian: We will continue having this discussion. No decisions have been made yet but reconsidering the mathematical calculation for determining the spots will most likely occur.
