

LES Board Report

January 2017

- All students in grades kindergarten through sixth grade have completed their winter MAP benchmarking tests. The students were challenged to meet their individual MAP goals and all students worked hard to do their best on these tests. A data chart will be shared with the Board of Education members at the January board meeting.
- We held our 2nd Quarter Recognition Assembly on Friday, January 13th. We are very proud of the students' accomplishments. Below are some of the highlights:
 - ✓ **70** total students were on the 2nd Quarter Honor/Super Honor Roll. The total number of students on Super Honor Roll was **21**.
 - ✓ We only have eight intermediate students needing to be on a *Contract to Pass* (Students have a contract if they have failed one or more class.) This is the fewest number of students we've had on a contract since we implemented *Contracts to Pass* four years ago. This year we have implemented additional interventions for students on a *Contract to Pass*.
 - ✓ **166 tie-dye** and **black** MAP ribbons were distributed on Friday for the students' recent performance on the winter MAP testing. Students in all grades K – 6 earn these for performing at the 80% or above on the MAP benchmarking test.
 - ✓ We gave out **397** MAP goal ribbons (green, white and yellow) to students for meeting and/or exceeding their individual goals.
 - ✓ **45** Little Devils had perfect attendance for the entire 1st semester of school.
- LES Committee Work –
 - PBIS Team – This team gave an online survey regarding behavior and student expectations to all LES staff members in early December. On Feb. 1st they will be analyzing the survey results to discuss next steps for our PBIS work.
 - Curriculum Team – The curriculum team will be meeting with Mr. Wolf on an upcoming ER date to determine the next steps with our upcoming science curriculum work and revision work for our math and language arts documents.
 - Instructional Strategies Team – Mrs. Dragan and Mr. Wolf recently previewed a science curriculum called *Stemsscopes*. On our Feb. 1st early-release Wednesday work day, teachers from this committee will be learning about this resource and getting a free 30-day trial.
