Dear Superintendent «LastName»:

On November 23, 2016 the Louisville Gas and Electric and Kentucky Utilities Companies requested the Public Service Commission for authority to increase electric and gas rates. If approved as submitted individual schools could experience the following average utility cost increases:

LGE Electric: 8.5 percent

LGE Gas:

4.2 percent

· KU Electric:

6.4 percent

The PSC will suspend implementation of the proposed rates until July 17, 2017 to permit review of the request and for parties to voice their concerns. KSBA has intervened on behalf of districts, most recently in 2014 with contributions from affected districts to an intervention fund. In other prior proceedings funding was provided by the Council for Better Education ("CBE"). The CBS will be providing \$25,000 for the current proceedings. Because those funds may not cover all intervention costs your district is being asked to consider committing to contribute to a Supplemental Intervention Fund of \$10,000 to cover legal and professional witness costs should the need arise. Attached is a list showing the cost per district if all or half of the eighty-three affective districts participate.

As a first step, we are asking that you respond by email to Ron Willhite (ron.willhite@ksba.org) indicating **Yes** or **NO** that you will recommend to your board participation up to the amount shown in the "Half" participating column. We are asking for an up to commitment as we cannot predict if all districts will participate. In the 2014 proceeding only four districts declined participation. Next please insert that amount in the attached Resolution and present to your Board for authorization to participate in the intervention and committing the Board to reimburse KSBA for the Board's share of actual incurred costs that exceed the CBE contribution.

Your immediate attention to this matter is requested.
