APPLICABLE STATUE(S), REGULATIONS OR BOARD POLICY: Board must approve the use of certified commercial carriers (Policy 9.36).


FISCAL/BUDGETARY IMPACT: The cost of this transportation will be covered by May Valley activity funds.

Lesson Plan

Fifth Grade Field Trip

The Capitol, The Old Capitol, and The Kentucky Museum

Objectives: Students will observe, listen, and learn about Kentucky government and the roles played within the government. Students will develop an appreciation for Our Capitol city and the wealth of knowledge and history there. Students will experience "adventures in Kentucky history." They will also observe and experience visually, auditory, and tactically the basic needs, the forms of education, forms of entertainment, and survival skills of the pioneers. They will understand social roles and expectations in history, specifically Kentucky history. They will understand how society has changed since the pioneer days.
