Changes for 2016-2017 (this school year)

- 1. <u>Achievement</u>—At the high school level, the Language Mechanics score from the ACT has been removed. ACT announced they will no longer provide those subscores.
- 2. <u>Growth</u>—At the high school level, growth was not included due to lack of ACT Plan scores.
- 3. <u>Program Review</u>—Program Reviews are now capped at 8 points when calculating the overall score for PR. Example: AH scored 9.8; PL scored 5.0 and WR scored 9.2. Last year, the score would have been 100% because of the total to 24 points. However, AH and WR would be capped at 8 points so the total would only be 21 and the result would only be 87.5.

Proposed Accountability System for next year

- I. <u>Proficiency (Elementary, Middle & High)</u>
 - Student performance on state tests reading, mathematics, science, social studies and writing.
 - English learners student group's progress on an English proficiency assessment

II. Growth (Elementary & Middle)

- Percentage of students who meet annual personal target for improvement based on individual student trajectory toward proficiency
 - Reading
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Writing

III. <u>Transition Readiness (Elementary, Middle & High)</u>

A student's attainment of the necessary knowledge, skills, and dispositions to successfully transition to the next level of his/her education career.

- ES-Foundational learning in non-tested subjects; various career fields; essential skills
- MS-Continued exploration of non-tested subjects; career fields; demonstration of essential skills

• High School

- 5 year adjusted cohort graduation rate
- Foundational essential skills (97% attendance; 10 hrs work-based learning experience or service learning or community service; ILP

AND

(one of the following)

- Academic-ready meets benchmarks on college entrance exam or Dual Credit or AP
 - Technical-ready meets benchmarks on KOSSA or earns Industry Certificate or Dual Credit
 - Military-ready meets benchmark on ASVAB

IV. Achievement GAP (Elementary, Middle & High)

Disparity in performance between student groups with a goal of reducing or closing the gap by moving all students to higher levels and moving those at lowest levels more rapidly.

V. Opportunity and Access (Elementary, Middle & High)

The equitable availability to research-based student experiences and school factors that impact student success.

- Whole Child supports (suspension data by student groups; chronically absent students)
- Equitable Access (opportunities to courses; primary talent pool; gifted; advanced coursework)
