### RISE! Conference 3/18/2017

Participated in the first "RISE! Re-Imagining Special Education" conference, held at the Muhammad Ali Center. The main focus of the event was engagement in honest and safe discussions of ECE education barriers, challenges, and successes across role groups. From my perspective, the highlight of the event and what made it successful was the centrality of student voice. One ECE student spoke about the importance – and rarity - of engaging the student in all discussions of how best to meet the individual student's needs. I would suggest that this is a lesson that applies to every aspect of education, not just ECE.
