- Early Child Care Centers-Beautiful, safe, learning environments for children ages 6 weeks to 5 years old. Our credentialed teachers focus on children's social and emotional development as well as education.
- In School Preschools/Blended Preschools-These programs are housed in classrooms at public schools in Northern Kentucky to turn a half day of early education to a full day.
- **Extended Education-**These programs are housed in classrooms at public schools in Northern Kentucky to turn a half day of kindergarten learning into a full day, with before and after school care.
