## 2017 Quality Improvement Grant Application

## **Early Care and Education Program Need and Vision**

The Marion County Public Schools preschool program has a need for funding in the category of classroom and instructional quality. We currently have seven classrooms in three different elementary schools. Our classrooms are in need of items such as furnishings, curriculum, resources, and manipulatives throughout all of their centers to ensure our children are attending a high quality preschool program. With ECERS-3 and KY All STARS requirements, many of our items are not considered in good repair and need to be replaced as we are in cohort 2 and up for review in 2018-2019. As a result of recent classroom walkthrough's, we have determined an area we need to address is the diversity in our classrooms. An additional need based on the walkthrough's include area of school readiness, especially cognitive, language, and social/emotional development. We are also in great need of resources to address diversity in our classrooms. We need a variety resources and materials to address each of these areas. Our vision is for all students in Marion County to have the opportunity to attend a high quality preschool program that will ensure they enter school with the skills necessary to be successful.

## **Action Plan**

With the funds from this grant, we will be able to purchase items to improve classroom and instructional quality to improve school readiness. We have centers in our classrooms in desperate need of items to provide opportunities to improve language development, opportunities for our teachers to ask questions, opportunities for our students to explore and investigate, and provide our children with manipulatives for hands on learning.

The 2017 Early Childhood Profile indicates we have approximately 510 three and four year olds in Marion County. Currently, we have 343 three and four year olds attending either state funded preschool, private school preschool, Head Start, or a daycare preschool program. The profile also indicates that as a county, only 39.2% of our kindergarten students were ready for school in the cognitive area, 69.4% in language development, 63.5% in physical development, 45.8% in self-help, and 75.9% in social/emotional development. Our action plan focuses on ensuring a high quality preschool program. During the 2016-2017 school year, we focused on the area of social and emotional development in our preschool classrooms. We purchased the Second Step program and have implemented it into our preschool curriculum daily. With funds from this grant, we can continue to improve the quality of our program by addressing cognitive, language, physical, and the self-help domains.
