Improvements

1. Based on experiences implementing a Non-Traditional Instruction plan in 2016-2017, what will the district change in order to improve the program for all its stakeholders (students, teachers, administrators, parents, community members, etc.) and grow in rigor and efficacy for 2017-2018?

MCPS aims to grow its instructional program into a true, **blended learning** environment. The district continues to focus on its' new, 21st Century tenets (communication, collaboration, commitment, creativity, critical thinking, and content) to strengthen a guaranteed, viable curriculum that not only ensures students are college and/or career ready, but **life ready**!

Specifically, the board of education committed to a **1:1 initiative** at the high school level in 2016-17 and a similar initiative for 2017-18 at our reconfigured Grade 8-9 building with all classroom teachers and students having access to their own **Google Chrome Books**. Teachers have already completed training led by some of their peers who were selected to create model classrooms focused on blended learning. Additional training has included professional development led by Google Certified Teacher, Laura Raganas. This effort improved both **rigor** and **efficacy** for students every day. Our goal is a learning environment where a non-traditional day is like any other day of the year with greater opportunities for students to **access the curriculum anytime, anywhere**.

Our experience implementing the NTI program has resulted in some programming adjustments for 2017-18. Stakeholder survey results show that more **communication** is warranted with earlier media attention needed to inform everyone about the logistics, assignments, and opportunities for assistance on an NTI day. Also, our **"Getting Ready"** nights, designed to answer questions, offer technology training, and provide the first assignments will be held earlier in the year.

Food Service Staff

For 2017-18, MCPS would like classified food service employees to bank their time on NTI days and serve it during our **Summer Feeding Program**. Our program is one of the state's largest – with over 14,000 meals served each summer. In addition to making lunches which are distributed county-wide, our district also operates an open site on Main Street for walk-ins and utilizes our new Dream Bus which has the capability of delivering meals to individuals who have no transportation or are not able to visit one of the over 50 other sites and programs who receive our meals.

Our district is home to one of **KY TECH's** area technology centers. The administration and faculty at the Marion County center partners with MCPS to offer their own NTI day assignments. Students enrolled in courses at the center do access NTI assignments for those courses and complete them in the same fashion as courses offered at the high school.
