



State-Funded Preschool FUNDING RATES

Kentucky Board of Education June 7, 2017

History/Background

- The state-funded preschool program offers comprehensive services to three- and four-year-old children with disabilities and low income 4-year-old children (160% of federal poverty).
- Each year KBE reviews proposed preschool per-child funding rates for approval.



Funding Formula

- A formula is used to provide funding to school districts, and amounts are based on the average number of children served on December 1 and March 1 of the previous academic year.
- There is a standard "per-child" rate for three categories of enrollment (at-risk, speech, developmental delays).
- There's a weighted category for three- and fouryear-olds with severe disabilities.

- District funding is based on average enrollment of 100 eligible preschool students.
- There are five preschool classrooms in the district with 20 students enrolled in each classroom.




