

Hardin County Schools Educational Television Coordinator, Mrs. Gina Ryan, secured a grant from PBS and KET in order to produce a short video segment about bat research at Mammoth Cave National Park. Part of that segment, produced October 3rd, showcased Central Hardin High School students helping with an aspect of the research using STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math). Students conducted counts of bats in a maternity colony. This is important in order to ascertain the effect that White Nose Syndrome is having on bat populations within the park.

- The Central Hardin Bruin JROTC Raider Teams finished with the school best combined times at the Allen County-Scottsville High School Patriot Challenge October 15th in Scottsville, KY. The teams completed the regular season by placing 1st in the Junior Varsity Division and 2nd in the Varsity Division. The meet featured 21 Army JROTC teams from TN and KY. The Bruin JV team completed the course in the time of 1:34:51, 11 minutes faster than the next team, and over 41 minutes faster than the average junior varsity team. The varsity team finished at 1:13:14, 3 minutes behind 1st place, and 27 minutes faster than the average varsity team. The Varsity team completed the season with a 77-1 record against Army and Marine JROTC schools from IN, OH, TN, and KY. Central Hardin finished as the top school in each of their competitions. The Bruins will compete at the Army JROTC Raider Nationals on 5 November in Molena, Ga. The Bruins have placed in the top 20 the last 2 years.


- > CHHS junior and Panera Bread employee, Corey Tilley treated faculty & staff three times this year with Panera Bread bagels!


