**The Weiss Institute, a partnership between Say Yes to Education and America's Promise Alliance, will expand the capacity of communities to make it possible for all young people to earn a college degree or other postsecondary credential.** Inspired by philanthropist George Weiss, who founded the nonprofit organization Say Yes to Education 30 years ago, the Institute builds on the work of Say Yes and of America's Promise Alliance, the nation's largest network dedicated to improving the lives of children and youth. Collectively, these organizations have five decades of experience and knowledge in helping communities come together to best support young people, preschool to career, on the path to adult success.

**Often, communities take a short-term, single-issue approach to a challenge that requires nothing less than long-term, community-wide structural and cultural change.** The Weiss Institute will provide tools and expertise to support communities in their efforts to:

- Identify and leverage their strengths
- Build trust and civic infrastructure, along with processes for collaborative governance
- Establish incentives to drive sustainable collaboration
- Eliminate or reduce predictable barriers to academic achievement
- Close the equity gap in education
- Break the cycles of intergenerational poverty
- Prepare young people for meaningful careers, lifelong learning and civic engagement
- Build a college-going culture and increase postsecondary degree attainment
- Improve community vitality and economic development.

**The Weiss Institute will bring together the best thinking, latest research and community-tested strategies for the benefit of communities seeking to help more students get on a path to adult success.** An applied research and technical assistance center, the Institute will:

- Commission research to advance the understanding of how communities can most effectively support young people
- Organize and lead convenings around the country where participants can learn about best practices from partner organizations and each other
- Lead site visits to communities engaging in best practice
- Provide fee-for-service technical assistance to help communities create and implement strategies locally
- Increase awareness and encourage adoption of strategies that work.
