<u>KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION</u> <u>STAFF NOTE</u>

Review Item:

702 KAR 7:065, Designation of Agent to Manage Middle and High School Interscholastic Athletics and Revisions in Kentucky High School Athletic Association Bylaws (KHSAA) (Second Reading)

Rationale:

To bring forward 702 KAR 7:065 for final approval of the proposed changes that are recommended by KHSAA's membership and Board of Control.

Applicable Statute or Regulation:

KRS 156.070 702 KAR 7:065 KHSAA Bylaws

History/Background:

Existing Policy. 702 KAR 7:065 (included as attachment "A") designates the KHSAA as the entity to manage middle and high school interscholastic athletics.

This regulation also requires that the Association conduct a biennial review of its Constitution and Bylaws at both the high school and middle school level, and such was done during the 2015-2016 school years by the KHSAA Board of Control for the high school rules, and by the required two meetings of the KHSAA Middle School Advisory Committee for the rules at that level.

Summary: The proposed changes to the high school regulations that received the requisite 2/3 vote (included as attachment "B") reflect items that were presented to the membership of the Association at its September 14, 2016 Annual Meeting of high schools. Items considered at this Annual Meeting are submitted both by the Board of Control as part of its annual Constitution and Bylaws review, and by the member high schools, and are reviewed by the Board of Control prior to the development of the final agenda. At the 2016 annual meeting of the member high schools, 219 high schools were present; therefore, all proposals required 146 affirmative votes for passage. In accordance with the KHSAA Constitution and Policies and Procedures as well as the requirements of 702 KAR 7:065, any amendment receiving the requisite vote of the membership is to be considered by the Board of Control and a recommendation made to the Kentucky Board of Education for further action.

During that annual meeting, significant discussion was held by the membership as to the future of interscholastic athletics. National trends were reviewed and the school representatives participated in spirited discussions about the balance between adapting to the students of today and meeting their needs, and preserving the sound traditions of competition. This meeting will likely continue to shape the future of this 100-year old organization.

It should also be noted that the Board of Control, as part of its required bylaw and policy review, responded to many concerns expressed by individual member school representatives and authored several proposals designed to address those concerns. Many of these desired changes that had been expressed to the Board required the "tightening" of existing rules relative to both transfers and undue influence on those transfers, or additional and extensive involvement by the member school representatives in attempting to enforce more rigid restrictions and interpretations. Interestingly, the rules that would have created tighter rules and required more membership involvement, in many cases failed to get the necessary vote for passage. Such was noted by the Board members as they charted the course for continued review as required by 702 KAR 7:065.

In accordance with these procedures, the amendments to the KHSAA Bylaws for its high school members that were listed below were approved by the listed votes. These amendments will be considered by the Local Superintendents Advisory Council at its upcoming meetings, and have been considered by the Board of Control (BOC) of the KHSAA for implementation during the 2017-18 school year, unless otherwise noted, and received the requisite vote of the Board of Control.

Subsequent to the Annual Meeting of the membership, and acting on the lengthy discussion surrounding one of the proposals at the Annual Meeting that did not receive the requisite vote, the Board revised one of its original proposals. The intent of the Board's discussion was to respond to membership feedback about excesses in out-of-season play while maintaining school choice in specific situations. The off-season play not only was documented as leading to burnout (both coaches and athletes), but was a large factor in many transfers for perceived athletic advantage.

The revised proposal was re-submitted to the membership in the form of a two-part referendum (included as Attachment "C") to address the issues identified by member schools as well as rectify issues in the proposals submitted to the membership. A referendum is an addition detailed in the KHSAA Constitution for amending the KHSAA Bylaws by a vote of the member schools. The vote of the schools on those two issues met the requisite standard of a two-thirds vote of those submitted, and the Board of Control recommends approval to the Kentucky Board of Education as detailed below.

The KHSAA is currently revising its necessary bylaws and policies required due to the passage of HB520 during the 2017 legislative session of the Kentucky General Assembly. Necessary amendments have been included into the documents incorporated by reference.

The KHSAA is also designated to manage interscholastic athletics at the middle school level. The Middle School Advisory Committee held two meetings as required by regulation, on February 16, 2017 and May 4, 2017. The focus of those meetings was health and safety for middle school athletes, and further items and requests for amendments will be brought forward to the Kentucky Board of Education at a future date.

The staff of the KHSAA certifies that the Board of Control has taken action on the recommended items as documented by the minutes of Board of Control meetings.

Budget Impact: There is no fiscal impact to the Kentucky Department of Education's budget.
