Civics Exam Outline

- Starting July 2018 all graduating Seniors in Kentucky must pass a Civics exam based on the US Citizenship and Immigration Exam with a score of 60% or higher as a graduation requirement.
- The LCHS Social Studies Department in conjunction with the District Assessment Coordinator have created a 100 question multiple choice exam based on the US Citizenship and Immigration Exam.
- Starting in the 2017-2018 school year, students at LCHS will begin taking the exam at the end of their American Government course (Freshmen year). If students do not pass the exam the first time they will be given the exam again at the end of their US History course (Junior year).
 - Any Junior who still has not passed the Civics exam by their Senior year will receive specific intervention and will take the test as many times as necessary their Senior year.
 - Current Sophomores (17-18) will take the exam during their Sophomore year and if they do not pass will take it again at the end of their US History course (Junior year).
 - This exam is a graduation requirement but will not count as a part of the students' average in either American Government or US History.
- Data for the Civics exam will be added to the LCHS Longitudinal Data and entered into Infinite Campus if/when necessary.
