- 9 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 160.1591 requires the Kentucky Board
- of Education to promulgate an administrative regulation to guide student application, lottery, and
- enrollment in public charter schools. This administrative regulation sets forth the requirements for
- charter school student application, lottery, and enrollment.
- 13 Section 1. Definitions.
- 14 (1) "Academically behind" means at risk of academic failure.
- 15 () "Achievement gap" is defined in KRS-160.1590(2) and means the same as in KRS
- 16 158.649.
- 17 (2) "Adult student" means a student who is eighteen (18) years or older who is still eligible for
- enrollment and attendance at a school program pursuant to KRS 158.030 and 158.100.
- 19 ($\underline{3}$) "Applicant" is defined in KRS 160.1590(3).
- 20 () "Areas of exceptionality" means categories of disabilities of students with special needs.
- 21 (4) "At risk" means at risk of academic failure.

- 1 (5) "At risk of academic failure" means:
- 2 (a) Inclusion-in-a-subgroup-of-students-for-whom-there-is:
- 3 1. A significantly large gap between a student comparison group and student reference group;
- 4 or
- 5 2. A significantly large gap between a student demographic group and the goal of proficiency;
- 6 (b)—Attendance at a school identified pursuant to KRS 160.346(2) for targeted support or
- 7 intervention;
- 8 (<u>be</u>) Attendance at a school identified pursuant to KRS 160.346(3) for comprehensive support
- 9 and improvement;
- 10 (cd) Current achievement two (2) or more grade levels below the student's age group;
- 11 (de) Demonstration of poor academic skills, such as failure of two (2) or more subjects in two (2)
- of the past four (4) school years;
- 13 (ef) Consistent absence or tardy and absence twenty-five (25) or more unexcused days in the last
- two (2) school years and an overall grade point average below a C;
- 15 (fg) Suspension (in-school suspension or home suspension) two (2) or more times during the past
- school year and an overall grade point average below a C;
- 17 (gh) Family history of dropping out or lack of family support for the student in the completion of
- 18 school;
- 19 (\underline{h} i) Little or no participation in school cocurricular or extracurricular programs;
- 20 (ii) Below grade level in reading or math skills;
- 21 (jk) Indication of being socially isolated; or
- 22 (\underline{k}) An applicant's definition for this term in its authorizer approved charter application,
- 23 pursuant to KRS 160.1594(2).

- 1 (6) "Authorizer" or "public charter school authorizer" is defined in KRS 160.1590(13).
- 2 () "Bilingual students" means students who are fluent in English and a-foreign-language.
- 3 (7) "Charter application" is defined in KRS 160.1590(4).
- 4 (8) "Charter contract" or "contract" is defined in KRS 160.1590(5).
- 5 (9) "Charter school" or "public charter school" is defined in KRS 160.1590(12).
- 6 (10) "Charter school board of directors" is defined in KRS 160.1590(6).
- 7 (11) "Cocurricular programs" means school programs which have activities that are
- 8 unequivocally instructional in nature, directly related to the instructional program, and scheduled
- 9 to minimize absences from classroom instruction.
- 10 (12) "Computerized randomization" means use of a computer software program for
- 11 randomization.
- 12 ()— "Comprehensive learning experiences" means daily, rigorous-learning experiences that
- build-on-a-student's talents, challenge-the-student's-skills-and-understandings, and develop the
- 14 student's ability to reason, problem solve, collaborate, and communicate to prepare the student-for
- 15 success in college and career.
- 16 (13) "Conversion public charter school" is defined in KRS 160.1590(7).
- 17 (14) "Days" means calendar days and shall be calculated pursuant to KRS 446.030.
- 18 (15) "Education service provider" is defined in KRS 160.1590(8).
- 19 (16) "Emancipated youth" means a student under the age of eighteen (18) who is or has been
- 20 married or has by court order or otherwise been freed from the care, custody, and control of the
- 21 student's parents.
- 22 (17) "Enrollment" means the process for the charter school board of directors to register a
- 23 student for attendance at the charter school.

- 1 (18) "Enrollment preference" means the priority of the student application from students
- 2 identified in KRS 160.1591(5).
- 3 (19) "Extracurricular programs" means voluntary programs that are offered by a school but are
- 4 not part of the required school program.
- 5 ()- "Gifted" means a "gifted-and-talented student" as defined-in-KRS 157.200(1)(n).
- 6 (20) "Grade" or "Grade Level" or "Level" means a single elementary, middle, or high school
- 7 grade of school.
- 8 (21) "Human randomization" means randomization without the use of computer randomization.
- 9 (22) "Knowingly" means that a person knew that in authorizing, ordering, or carrying out
- an act or omission that the act or omission constituted a violation of a statute or
- 11 administrative regulation.
- 12 (23) "Local school district" is defined in KRS 160.1590(10).
- 13 (24) "Lottery" means the transparent, open, equitable, and impartial process that is competently
- 14 conducted with randomization in accordance with the targeted student population and service
- 15 community as identified in KRS 160.1593(3) for the charter school board of directors to choose
- students for enrollment and attendance at the charter school when the student applications received
- by the charter school exceed the charter school's capacity.
- 18 (25) "Multiple" means a person who was born on the same date as at least one (1) other
- 19 sibling.
- 20 (26) "Notice" means written notice.
- 21 (27) "Notify" means provide written notice.
- 22 (28) "Parent" is defined in KRS 160.1590(11).
- 23 (29) "Persistently low-achieving public schools" or "Persistently low-achieving noncharter

- 1 public schools" means noncharter <u>public</u> schools identified for comprehensive support and
- 2 improvement pursuant to KRS 160.346.
- 3 (30) "Person with custody or charge" means any adult, pursuant to KRS 159.010, who falls
- 4 within the definition of KRS 387.010(2) for interested person or entity and with whom the student
- 5 resides.
- 6 (31) "Primary enrollment preference" means any enrollment preference other than a secondary
- 7 enrollment preference.
- 8 (32) "Randomization" means to leave to chance alone and eliminate bias and interference.
- 9 (33) "Secondary enrollment preference" means the priority of a resident student application for
- enrollment in a public charter school, after acceptance of all the student applications with primary
- enrollment preference, if the public charter school's capacity has not been exceeded for that
- 12 school year.
- 13 (<u>34</u>) "Start-up public charter school" is defined in KRS 160.1590(17).
- 14 (35) "Student" is defined in KRS 160.1590(19) and includes any person who is entitled to
- enrollment and attendance at a school program as provided in KRS 158.030 and 158.100.
- 16 (36) "Student application" means an application submitted to a charter school board of directors
- for student enrollment in the charter school.
- 18 (37) "StudentsChildren with special needs" or "Special needs students" means:
- 19 (a) Exceptional children and youth students, as defined in KRS 157.200, who are eligible
- pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. secs. 1400 et seq. for an
- 21 individual education plan, as described in KRS 157.196, or an individual education program, as
- described in KRS 158.281; and
- 23 (b) Students who are eligible for services under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973,

- as amended, 29 U.S.C. sec. 794, to prevent substantial limitation of one or more major life
- 2 activities.
- 3 (38) "Traditionally underperforming" means at risk of academic failure.
- 4 (39) "Year" or "Academic year" or "School year" means school year as defined in KRS
- 5 **158.050.**
- 6 Section 2. Student Application. (1) Any parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or
- 7 emancipated youth student who has the ability to enroll the student pursuant to Kentucky law
- 8 may initiate a student application to a charter school for the any student, for-whom-the-parent,
- 9 person with custody or charge, adult student, or emancipated youth-student has the ability to enroll
- pursuant to Kentucky law, who is eligible for attendance at the charter school under KRS 158.030,
- 11 158.100, or 160.1591(5) or (6).
- 12 (2) Any adult student or emancipated youth student may initiate the student's own application
- to a charter school.
- 14 (3) A student application for enrollment in a charter school shall list the grade level the
- parent, person with custody or charge guardian, adult student, or emancipated youth student
- understands to be the most appropriate grade level for the student based on available
- information. Any future determination by the resident **local** school district or the charter school
- that the student should be placed in a different grade level shall not invalidate the student's
- application unless the charter school determines that the parent, person with custody or charge
- 20 guardian, adult student, or emancipated youth student knowingly intentionally misrepresented
- 21 the grade level most appropriate for the student on the student application.

- 1 (4) Consent of the parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or emancipated youth
- student to serve on the charter school's board of directors shall not be a condition for student
- 3 application to the charter school.
- 4 (5) The charter school shall not limit the number of applications that it accepts from students
- 5 based on ethnicity, national origin, religion, sex, income level, disabling condition, proficiency in
- 6 the English language, or academic or athletic ability, in violation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964,
- 7 42 U.S.C. secs. 1981 to 2000h-6, as amended, <u>Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972</u>,
- 8 **20 U.S.C. 1681, as amended,** KRS 160.1591(5), or KRS 160.1593(19).
- 9 (6) For a start-up charter school, the enrollment preference described in KRS 160.1591(5)(d)
- is only available to:
- 11 (a) A child of a Kentucky resident who is on the board of directors and resides within the
- 12 charter school's enrollment boundaries; or
- 13 (b) A child of a Kentucky resident who will be a full-time employee of the charter school
- 14 and resides within the charter school's enrollment boundaries.
- 15 (7) The charter school shall utilize a uniform application process for all student applications,
- including use of the Kentucky Charter School Student Application, incorporated by reference.
- Section 3. Lottery. (1) A charter school board of directors shall create and publish policies and
- procedures for conducting the lottery that include the following:
- 19 (a) Identification and designation of duties for <u>charter school</u> board members, any education
- service provider, charter school staff, and volunteers prior to the lottery event;
- 21 (b) Segregation of duties to decrease the likelihood of errors, mitigate the risk of interference,
- and increase the public perception that the lottery is a randomized, transparent, open, equitable,
- and impartial process that is competently conducted;

- 1 (c) Provision for breaks during the lottery;
- 2 (d) Retention of records from the lottery for two (2) years;
- 3 (e) Creation of minutes from the lottery; and
- 4 (f) Procedures for receipt, investigation, and handling of written complaints regarding the
- 5 lottery with concurrent provision of all documents to the charter authorizer, the commissioner of
- 6 **education**, and the Board. Procedures shall include:
- 7 l. Any remedies the charter school shall provide upon determination that student
- 8 selection during the lottery was affected by an error committed by individuals acting on behalf of
- 9 the charter school during the application or lottery processes;
- 10 2. Transparency in the charter school's remedying of such an error; and
- 3. Actions to prevent reoccurrence of errors in the application and lottery processes in
- 12 future years.
- 13 (2) A charter school board of directors shall conduct the lottery in compliance with the
- requirements of KRS 160.1591, 160.1592, 701 KAR Chapter 8, and its policies and procedures,
- that may include, as allowed by the charter authorizer:
- 16 (a) Selection of numbers assigned to individual students; and
- 17 (b) Human randomization or computerized randomization.
- 18 (3) The charter school shall afford primary <u>enrollment preferences</u> and secondary enrollment
- preferences only to students as allowed in KRS 160.1591, 160.1592, and this administrative
- regulation, as designated in the charter application, and as allowed in the charter contract.
- 21 (4) A charter school shall not conduct a lottery for enrollment if the number of student
- applications does not exceed the capacity of the charter school for that school year, as stated in
- 23 <u>the charter school's charter contract.</u>

- 1 (5) If the number of student applications exceeds the capacity of the charter school for the
- 2 school year, then pursuant to KRS 160.1592(5)(c), the charter school shall reserve space for
- 3 enrollment of returning students and then conduct the lottery for the other student applications.
- 4 (6) If the number of student applications with enrollment preferences meeting the requirements
- of subsection (3) of this section exceeds the capacity of the charter school for the school year, the
- 6 charter school shall include in the lottery for enrollment only those students with enrollment
- 7 preferences.
- 8 (7) Selection in the lottery of a student who is a multiple shall also result in:
- 9 (a) The automatic selection of the student's multiple siblings who have submitted a
- student application to that charter school for attendance that school year, unless this would
- exceed the capacity of the charter school; or
- 12 (b) If the automatic selection of the student's multiple siblings would exceed the capacity
- of the charter school for that school year, the automatic placement of the student's multiple
- siblings at the top of the wait list.
- 15 (8) At least thirty (30) days prior to conducting a lottery, the charter school board of directors
- shall publish on its website notice of the lottery and hold a meeting to provide information on the
- 17 lottery to parents, persons with custody or charge, adult students, and emancipated youth students.
- 18 The notice shall include:
- 19 (a) The date and location of the lottery and the information meeting to be held prior to the
- 20 lottery pursuant to subsection (9) of this section;
- 21 (b) Information on the legal requirements and policies and procedures utilized in holding the
- 22 lottery;
- 23 (c) Information for filing a <u>written</u> complaint regarding the lottery monitor;

- 1 (d) Information for filing a written complaint regarding an error committed by individuals
- 2 acting on behalf of the charter school during the application or lottery processes; and
- 3 (e) Identification of the charter school for the lottery.
- 4 (9) At least twenty (20) days prior to conducting a lottery, the charter school shall hold a
- 5 meeting to provide the lottery information in subsection (8) of this section to parents, persons
- 6 <u>with custody or charge, adult students, and emancipated youth students.</u>
- 7 (108) The charter authorizer may include in the charter contract a requirement for the charter
- 8 school board of directors to conduct a practice lottery, in the presence of the lottery monitor, to
- 9 reduce shareholder concerns, to identify potential issues and perceptions with the selected lottery
- method, and to build the charter school's capacity to conduct the lottery.
- 11 (119) The charter school shall not require the presence of the parent, person with custody or
- charge, adult student, or emancipated youth student at the lottery for inclusion in the lottery or for
- eligibility for enrollment.
- 14 (1210) The charter school shall not require the consent of the parent, person with custody or
- 15 charge, adult student, or emancipated youth student to serve on the charter school board of
- directors for inclusion in the lottery or for eligibility for enrollment.
- 17 (134) If a charter school determines capacity by grade level, then the charter school shall hold
- lotteries only in those grade levels where student applications exceeded the charter school's
- capacity and shall hold separate lotteries, which may occur on the same date, for each of those
- grade levels. A student shall be eligible for the lottery for the grade level listed on the student's
- 21 application, unless the charter school and the parent, persons with custody or charge, adult
- 22 student, or emancipated youth student agree otherwise.
- 23 (1<u>4</u>2) The lottery <u>and the information meeting required in subsection (9) of this section shall</u>

- each be held in accordance with the Open Meetings Act at a time and location convenient to
- 2 parents, persons with custody or charge, adult students, and emancipated youth students who have
- 3 submitted a student application for enrollment in the charter school.
- 4 (153) The lottery shall be monitored by a competent, independent, impartial party to ensure
- 5 compliance with KRS 160.1591 and 160.1592 as follows:
- 6 (a) The charter school board of directors shall include the identity, qualifications, and
- 7 affiliations of the lottery monitor in the information they provide to the public thirty (30) days
- 8 prior to the lottery, pursuant to subsection (87) of this section, and in the lottery information
- 9 meeting held pursuant to subsection (9) of this section;
- 10 (b) Complaints regarding the competence, independence, or impartiality of the lottery monitor
- shall be provided in writingbrought to the commissioner of education who shall conduct an
- investigation and render a decision within seven (7) days of receipt of the written complaint; and
- 13 (c) If the lottery monitor is determined by the commissioner of education to lack competence,
- independence, or impartiality, the commissioner of education shall appoint an individual who does
- meet these requirements to serve as a monitor for the lottery selection process.
- 16 (164) In the lottery, the charter school shall select students for enrollment up to the capacity of
- the school <u>for that school year</u> and then the charter school shall select students for inclusion on
- the wait list above the school capacity as follows:
- 19 (a) The charter school shall continue to select students for placement on the wait list until the
- charter school has exhausted the student applications for that school year;
- 21 (b) The charter school shall ensure that lottery drawing for the wait list is separate from the
- 22 lottery for selection of students for enrollment and that each parent, person with custody or charge,
- adult student, and emancipated youth student, who submitted a student application to the charter

- school and is placed on a wait list, is notified in writing of the student's inclusion on the wait list
- 2 and the student's position on the wait list after the conclusion of the wait list lottery process;
- 3 (c) The charter school shall place students on the wait list in the order they are drawn during
- 4 that portion of the lottery process;
- 5 (d) The charter school shall maintain and continuously update accurate records related to the
- 6 order of the wait list;
- 7 (e) The charter school shall update the wait list as students are admitted; and
- 8 (f) The charter school shall weekly publish on its website updated information on each
- 9 student's position on the wait list as well as the last date for enrollment for that year; and
- 10 (g) The charter school shall place student applications received after the lottery on the
- wait list, in the order received, after the students placed on the wait list through the lottery
- 12 **process** in this section.
- 13 Section 4. Student Enrollment. (1) A charter school shall include in its policies and procedures
- 14 on student enrollment:
- 15 (a) Notice of the status of an enrollment preference and eligibility for a student if the student
- ceases to be a resident of the local school district prior to or during the school year;
- 17 (b) Notice of the status of an enrollment preference for a sibling under KRS 160.1591(5)(c)
- if the student who was enrolled the previous <u>school</u> year withdraws from the charter school;
- 19 (c) Notice of the status of an enrollment preference for a student under KRS 160.1591(5)(d)
- if the resident ceases to be a member of the board of directors or ceases to be a full-time
- employee of the charter school prior to or during the school year; and
- 22 (d) Notice of the status of an enrollment preference for a student under KRS 160.1591(5)(e)
- 23 if the student ceases to be eligible for free or reduced price meals prior to or during the school

- 1 year; and
- 2 (e) Notice of the status of an enrollment preference for a student under KRS
- 3 160.1591(5)(e) if the student's former school ceases to be a persistently low-achieving public
- 4 school prior to the school year the student shall attend the charter school.
- 5 (2) A charter school shall accept student applications for enrollment and attendance from all
- 6 <u>local school district</u> resident students who are eligible for enrollment based on KRS 158.030,
- 7 158.100, 160.1591(5) or (6) as follows:
- 8 (a) Only a student who is a Kentucky resident of the local school district by the student's
- 9 first day of student attendance is eligible for enrollment and attendance at the charter school that
- 10 school year; and
- 11 (b) A student who attended the public charter school the previous year shall be automatically
- re-enrolled for attendance each school year unless:
- 13 1. The student has been awarded a high school diploma after meeting or exceeding the
- minimum requirements for high school graduation set by the Board;
- 15 2. The charter school has expelled the student pursuant to KRS 158.150; or
- 16 3. A court has ordered placement of the student in another school or another local
- 17 school district; or
- 18 4. The student has voluntarily withdrawn from enrollment in the charter school.
- 19 (3) In addition to the requirements of KRS 160.1592(14), a charter school shall not
- discourage, restrict, or prohibit enrollment of a student, including but not limited to:
- 21 (a) Based on whether the emancipated youth student, adult student, parent, or person with
- custody or charge gives consent for the charter school to unenroll or withdraw the student from
- the charter school without providing the due process protections in KRS 158.150;

- 1 (b) Based on the student's disability, academic performance, athletic ability, or the ability of
- 2 the parent or person with custody or charge to volunteer at the charter school;
- 3 (c) Based on the student's ability to meet academic minimum requirements;
- 4 (d) Based on the student's English competence;
- 5 (e) Based on the student's status as a student with special needs;
- 6 (f) Based on the student's status as a student at risk of academiceducational failure;
- 7 (g) Based on the student's status as a homeless child or youth, under the McKinney-Vento
- 8 Homeless Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 11301 et seq.; or
- 9 (h) Based on the student's eligibility for free or reduced price meals, under the Richard B.
- 10 Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.
- 11 (4) In addition to the requirements of KRS 160.1592(14), a charter school shall not:
- 12 (a) Require or request an interview prior to enrollment;
- 13 (b) Require or request:
- 14 <u>1. Letters of recommendation;</u>
- 15 2. Essays;
- 16 <u>Resumes or information regarding a student's school or community activities;</u>
- 17 <u>4. Grades;</u>
- 18 <u>5. Test scores</u>;
- 19 <u>6. Attendance records; or</u>
- 20 7. Disciplinary history except as allowed pursuant to KRS 158.155
- 21 Select a student based on the student's performance on entrance essays or interviews;
- 22 (c) Require or request:
- 23 1. Proof of a Social Security card or number, U.S. birth certificates, visa, or citizenship;

- 1 2. Information on the legal residence or presence in the United States of the student, parent,
- 2 or person with custody or charge; or
- 3 3. Information regarding the cause of any student's residency with a person other than the
- 4 parent; or
- 5 (d) Require a family to volunteer at the charter school or provide payment to the school,
- 6 except:
- 7 1. As allowed in KRS 160.1592(14) for fees required on the same basis and to the same
- 8 extent as other public schools; and
- 9 2. The charter school may encourage parental involvement in the charter school as long as
- involvement is not required and there are no adverse consequences for the family orand student
- 11 whothat cannot be involved; or
- 12 (e) Require or request a parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or
- emancipated youth student to consent to the charter school's withdrawal or unenrollment
- of the student from the charter school without providing the due process protections in
- 15 KRS 158.150.
- 16 (5) A charter school shall enroll a student in compliance with KRS 158.032 and KRS
- 17 159.010.
- 18 (6) By the first day of a student's attendance, a charter school shall verify the residence of
- the student within the local school district and use methods similar to those employed by a
- 20 local school district to verify residence.
- 21 (7) A conversion public charter school shall accept for enrollment student applications with
- secondary enrollment preference after accepting student applications with primary enrollment
- preference, if the conversion public charter school's capacity has not been exceeded for that

- 1 school year. After complying with the primary enrollment preference requirement in KRS
- 2 160.1591(5)(b), a conversion public charter school may utilize the enrollment preferences in KRS
- 3 160.1591(5)(c-e) in enrolling additional <u>local school district</u> resident students pursuant to KRS
- 4 160.1591(5)(b).
- 5 (8) A charter school shall conduct enrollment as follows:
- 6 (a) A charter school shall establish and publish on its website an open enrollment period during
- 7 which the charter school shall accept applications for enrollment of new students;
- 8 (b) A charter school shall establish and publish on its website a specific deadline for
- 9 notification to parents, persons with custody or charge, adult students, or emancipated youth
- students of the charter school's decision to acceptance of the student's application for enrollment;
- 11 (c) A charter school shall notify parents, persons with custody or charge, adult students, and
- emancipated youth students with accepted applications of their opportunity to enroll in the
- charter school and the deadlines and required documentation for enrollment;
- 14 (d) A charter school shall establish and publish on its website a specific deadline for parents,
- persons with custody or charge, adult students, or emancipated youth students with accepted
- applications to notify the school of their enrollment decision and to initiate enrollment of the
- student in the charter school. Failure of the parent, person with custody or charge, adult student,
- or emancipated youth student to accept the enrollment offer and enroll the student during the open
- enrollment period may result in the forfeiture of an enrollment preference and result in enrollment
- of the student that school year only if capacity of the school has not been exceeded for that school
- year. Prior to forfeiture of the student's enrollment offer, a charter school shall attempt to enroll
- 22 the student by contacting the parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or emancipated
- youth student through at least two (2) of the following methods, until successful:

- 1 1. Phone;
- 2 2. Email;
- 3 3. Mailed correspondence; or
- 4 4. Home visit; and
- 5 (e) A charter school shall allow a parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or an
- 6 emancipated youth student to enroll the student for attendance at the charter school in the grade
- 7 level the parent, person with custody or charge, adult student, or emancipated youth student
- 8 understands to be the most appropriate grade level based on available information. Any future
- 9 determination by the resident <u>local</u> school district or the charter school that the student should be
- placed in a different grade level shall not invalidate the student's enrollment.
- 11 (9) A charter school shall only require the following documentation or information for student
- 12 enrollment:
- 13 (a) Proof of the student's **identity and** age, as required pursuant to KRS 158.032;
- 14 (b) Immunization records, as required by KRS 158.035;
