- FRAM Report To date, we have not been required to have our free and reduced numbers verified and entered until December 1st each year. This year the due date has been moved up to October 1st. The free and reduced income form is a difficult form for us to get parents to turn in and each year we resort to doing home visits in order to get some of these forms completed. Having only 5 weeks at the beginning of the school year has made this task extremely difficult. Our FRYSC coordinators and Stacy are doing the best they can to make this happen in the limited timeframe. Collecting this data is critical in establishing our poverty rate that is used so much in our funding; it is disheartening that we cannot have the needed time to assure accurate numbers.
- DPP Conference –Mike Wills and I attended the annual state DPP conference from September 13th thru the 15th. While I have close to a year experience, I attended the new DPP training session on the first day. Having the experience that I have so far made this training even more beneficial. We are fortunate to be part of the most active DPP association and we seem to network more than other regions.
